THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (ENEMY TERRITORY CESSATION) (UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS) ORDER, 1946, DATED SEPTEMBER 25, 1946, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

1946 No. 1563

The Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1939 (hereinafter called "the Act"), 2 & 3 Geo. 6. and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf do hereby make the c. 89. following Order:—

- 1. That area of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics which by virtue of Regulation 6 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1940(a), was immediately prior to the date of this Order treated as enemy territory for the purposes of Sections 3A, 4, 5 and 7 of the Act and for the purposes of any Order made under Section 7 shall cease to be so treated as from the date of this Order.
- 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Section 1 of the Act any person, unless the Board of Trade otherwise direct, may trade within the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics with any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business therein.
- 3. For the purposes of this Order the "Union of Soviet Socialist Republics" means all the territory of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics excluding any territory which has come under the administration of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics since the 31st day of December, 1938.
- 4. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Enemy Territory Cessation) (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) Order, 1946.

TRADING WITH THE ENEMY

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport)

The provisions of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1939, which is an Order made under Section 7 of the Act, continue to apply to the property in the United Kingdom of persons in areas which have ceased to be in the occupation of the enemy until it is otherwise decided.

Paragraph 1 of the present Order provides for the removal of this control in respect of the money and property of persons resident or carrying on business in the territories concerned except of those who still remain within the definition of "enemy" under the Act, e.g. by reason of German incorporation.

Paragraph 2 of the present Order removes any restriction so far as Section 1 of the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1939, is concerned, on trading within the territories concerned with any person carrying on business therein.
