**Diseases of Animals (Modification) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1993**

Made 5th February 1993

Coming into operation 8th February 1993

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 2(3) of the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Diseases of Animals (Modification) Order (Northern Ireland) 1993 and shall come into operation on 8th February 1993.

Modification of the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981

2. Part III of Schedule 1 to the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 shall be modified by:—

(a) adding to the list of diseases of animals the following—

“44. Contagious agalactia.”; and

(b) deleting at the end the words

“and aujeszky’s disease (32).”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order further modifies Schedule 1 to the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 ("the 1981 Order"). Article 2(a) adds contagious agalactia to the list of diseases of animals in Part III of that Schedule. The effect is to make contagious agalactia a disease regulated by the 1981 Order.

Article 2(b) removes the existing exemption from the requirements of Article 10(1) of the 1981 Order for animals affected with aujeszky's disease. A person having in his possession or under his charge such an animal must now give notice of the fact and keep it separate from other animals not so affected.
