“ If the agreement is in redemption of a weekly payment which includes supplementary allowances under the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementary Allowances) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, (whether the incapacity is permanent or not and whether the weekly payment has continued for six months or not), the sum agreed in respect of the supplementary allowances should be stated separately from the sum agreed in respect of the weekly payment payable under the principal Act.”

4.—(1) In paragraph (e) of Form 35 in the said Appendix, after the words “ the period for which it was paid,” there shall be inserted the words :—

“ and where such weekly payment includes an allowance or allowances under the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementary Allowances) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940, state separately the amount payable under the principal Act and the amount of each supplementary allowance.”

(2) The following paragraph shall be added to the said Form 35 after paragraph (f) :—

(g) The said _____ has the following children under the age of 15 years :—

(In the case of a male workman here give the name and date of birth of every such child as defined by section 1, sub-section 1 (b), and by section 5 of the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementary Allowances) Act (Northern Ireland), 1940.)

5.—These Rules may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation Rules (Northern Ireland), 1941, and the Workmen's Compensation Rules, 1929, as amended shall have effect as further amended by these Rules.

* These Orders, made by Northern Ireland authorities under powers conferred upon them by the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, or delegated to them under those Regulations, are treated as Orders to which the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, apply by virtue of an Order in Council (S. R. & O., 1940, No. 1750) dated 27th September, 1940, which added to Regulation 102A of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, the following paragraph :—

“(2) Where, for the purpose of any of these Regulations, any power is exercisable by the Governor of Northern Ireland (whether acting alone or in Council) or by any department of the Government of Northern Ireland, nothing in section 3 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, shall apply to any order, rule or bye-law made in the exercise of the said power, but the order, rule or bye-law shall be deemed to be a statutory rule to which the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, applies, notwithstanding that it does not relate to a matter in respect of which the Parliament of Northern Ireland has power to make laws.”
