3. This Order shall apply only in Northern Ireland.

4. This Order shall come into force on the first day of June, 1945, and may be cited as the Ryegrass (Control of Harvesting) Order, 1945.

Land Cultivation : Grass Seeds and Fertilisers

ORDER, DATED 5TH FEBRUARY, 1945, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER REGULATION 62 OF THE DEFENCE (GENERAL) REGULATIONS, 1939.

1945. No. 17

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers under Regulation 62 of the Defence (General) Regulations, 1939, delegated to it by the Delegation of Emergency Powers (Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland) (No. 2) Order, 1943, made by the Secretary of State under paragraph (1) of Regulation 102A of the said Regulations, hereby orders and directs as follows :—

1. The Grass Seeds and Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) General Order, 1944, shall have effect subject to the following amendments :—

(a) For sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 3 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraphs :—

“ (2) In the application of the foregoing direction to an occupier of land situate in the area to which this sub-paragraph relates sub-heads (a), (b), (c) and (d) of the said foregoing direction shall not have effect and for those sub-heads there shall be substituted the following sub-heads :—

(a) at least 30 lb. of Ryegrasses : and

(b) at least 7 lb. of Timothy : and

(c) at least 1 lb. of Wild White Clover of United Kingdom origin or White Clover certified by the New Zealand Government Department of Agriculture as of “ Mother Seed ” or as of “ Permanent Pasture ” standard.”

“(3) The area to which the last preceding sub-paragraph relates shall consist of the County of Fermanagh and the District Electoral Divisions of Aghafad, Dromore, Drumharvey, Ecclesville, Fallaghearn, Fintona, Greenan, Kilserry, Lifford, Moorfield, Rahony, Tattymoyle and Trillick, all in the Rural District of Omagh, and County of Tyrone”.

(b) In the proviso to paragraph 4 there shall be substituted for the words “the County of Fermanagh” the words “the area specified in sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 3 of this Order”.

2. This Order may be cited as the Grass Seeds and Fertilisers (Northern Ireland) Amendment Order, 1945.

1. The Tillage (Northern Ireland) General Order, 1944, shall have effect subject to the following amendment :

In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 6 there shall be substituted for the words “thirty-first day of December, 1944” the words “thirtieth day of April, 1945”.

2. This Order may be cited as the Tillage (Northern Ireland) Amendment Order, 1945.
