WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION**Supplementation**

REGULATIONS, DATED 19TH FEBRUARY, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (SUPPLEMENTATION) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1956.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of powers conferred by section 3 of the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1956(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1962, shall be read as one with the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1956(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") and shall come into operation on 26th February, 1962.

Amendment of regulation 15 of the principal regulations

2. For the proviso to regulation 15 of the principal regulations (which relates to the requirement to repay wrongly paid allowances) there shall be substituted the following proviso:

"Provided that repayment shall not be required in any case where it is shown to the satisfaction of the determining authority deciding the review or appeal that in the obtaining and receipt of the allowance the beneficiary, and any person acting for him, has throughout used due care and diligence to avoid overpayment."

Transitional provision for regulation 2 of these regulations

3. Where a decision that a person was or was not liable to repay to the Industrial Injuries Fund a payment by way of an allowance and to which regulation 15 of the principal regulations applied was given before the date of the coming into operation of these regulations, any appeal from or review of that decision determined on or after that date shall be determined in accordance with the provisions in force immediately before that date.
