

CHAPTER xxxviii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of A.D. 1927. the Minister of Health relating to Gillingham Hereford Margate Sheffield Swindon and Willenhall. [29th July 1927.]

WHEREAS the Minister of Health has made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act 38 & 39 Vict. 1875:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

- 1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be Orders in and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions schedule confirmed. thereof shall have full validity and force.

- (2) The Corporation may with the sanction of the Minister of Health from time to time alter or add to the tolls mentioned in the Schedule to this Order and any such altered tolls shall as from the date on which they come into operation be substituted for the corresponding tolls payable under the said Schedule.
- 3.—(1) The Minister of Health may direct any inquiries Inquiries an to be held by his inspectors which he may deem necessary with expenses. reference to the purposes of this Order and such inspectors shall for the purposes of any inquiry have all such powers as they have for the purposes of inquiries directed by the Minister under the Public Health Act 1875.
- (2) Where the Minister causes any such inquiry as aforesaid to be held the cost incurred by the Minister in relation to that inquiry (including such sum not exceeding five guineas a day as the Minister may determine for the services of any inspector or officer of the Minister engaged in the inquiry) shall be paid by the Corporation and the Minister may certify the amount of the costs so incurred and any sum so certified and directed by the Minister to be paid by the Corporation shall be a debt due to the Crown from the Corporation.

And whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Acts as so amended the Corporation carry on a water undertaking and supply water within the Borough and certain other areas (hereinafter referred to as "the water limits of the Corporation") and for the purposes of the undertaking have constructed and maintain certain works;

And whereas by section 16 of the Act of 1902 the Corporation are authorised to make agreements with the owners of lands within the water limits of the Corporation with reference to the execution by the Corporation or such owners of works for the drainage of such lands or for preserving the purity of the waters which the Corporation are for the time being authorised to take;

And whereas the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to alter or amend the Local Acts in the manner hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 303 of the Public Health Act 1875 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the Local Acts shall be altered and amended so that the following provisions shall take effect that is to say:—

1. The Corporation may from time to time contribute such Power to sum or sums as they may think fit towards the expenses incurred contribute by any local authority or person in the construction of any towards cost drainage or sewage works necessary for preserving the purity of the waters which the Corporation are for the time being authorised to take for the purposes of their water undertaking and also may from time to time carry out any work which may be necessary for preserving the purity of such waters.

2.—(1) In addition to any other borrowing powers possessed Additional by them the Corporation shall have power with the sanction of borrowing the Minister of Health to borrow on the security of the revenue power. of their water undertaking and of the district fund and general district rate or upon any of such securities such sums as may from time to time be necessary for the purposes of this Order.

(2) Any moneys so borrowed shall be repaid within such period not exceeding sixty years from the date of borrowing as

Provisional Order to enable the Sheffield Corporation to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts.

Sheffield (Acquisition of Lands) Order.

WHEREAS the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Sheffield (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") acting by the Council as the local authority for that City for the purposes of the Public Health Act 1875 require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto for the purposes of widening opening enlarging or otherwise improving certain streets in the said City:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by Section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other Statutes in that behalf hereby orders that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect that is to say:--

1. The Corporation shall be empowered for the purposes Compulsory aforesaid to put in force with reference to the lands described powers of in the Schedule hereto (subject to the continuance of existing purchasepublic rights of highway if any) the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts as modified by the Acquisition of Land (Assessment of Compensation) Act 1919 with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them.
