An Act for the better Maintenance and Repair of the Highways in Wildmore Fen and the East and West Fens in the County of Lincoln, and for other Purposes, and of which the Short Title is "The Wildmore Fen and East and West Fens Highways Act, 1853." [4th August 1853.]

HEREAS Two Acts were respectively passed in the Fortyfirst Year of George the Third, the anaistic is in first Year of George the Third, the one intituled An Act 41 G. 3. for dividing and allotting a certain Fen called Wildmore cc. cxli. and cxlii. Fen in the County of Lincoln, and the other intituled An Act for dividing and allotting certain Fens called the East and West Fens in 42 G. 3. the County of Lincoln: And whereas an Act was passed in the Forty- c. cviii. second Year of George the Third, intituled An Act for altering, amending, and rendering more effectual an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled 'An Act for dividing and allotting a certain Fen called Wildmore Fen in the County of Lincoln;' and for dividing, allotting in Severalty, and inclosing the parochial or general Allotments set out or to be set out in pursuance of the said Act, for compensating for the Tythes of such Allotments, and for declaring and determining to what Parish or Parishes the several Allotments of the said Fen shall belong: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fiftieth 50 G. 3. Year of George the Third, intituled An Act for amending and render- c. cxxix. [Local.] ing

ing more effectual an Act of His present Majesty, for dividing and allotting certain Fens called the East and West Fens in the County of Lincoln, and for dividing and inclosing the Parochial Allotments, Lands, and Grounds belonging to and in certain Parishes having Right of Common on the said Fens, and for declaring to what Parishes such Allotments shall belong: And whereas an Act was passed in the Fifty-second of George the Third, intituled An Act for forming into Townships certain extra-parochial Lands in Wildmore Fen and in the West and East Fens in the County of Lincoln: And whereas the respective Commissioners acting in execution of the first Four recited Acts respectively sold Parts of Wildmore Fen and the East and West Fens, amounting to Fourteen thousand Acres or thereabouts; and by the fifthly recited Act the Lands so sold, with other Lands, Parts of those Fens, were formed into Seven separate Townships, called respectively Eastville, Midville, Frithville, Carrington, Westville, Thornton-le-Fen, and Langriville: And whereas those respective Commissioners, by Two several Awards, dated respectively the Twenty-eighth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and twenty and the Thirtieth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and twenty, set out and awarded certain public and private Roads in those Fens, and awarded those public Roads, or some of them, to be within the Parishes, Townships, and Places specified in the First Schedule to this Act annexed, or some of them, and set out and awarded the Lands specified in the Second Schedule to this Act annexed for supplying Materials for the Repair of those public and private Roads respectively: And whereas it is apprehended that those Awards may have been inoperative, in declaring those public Roads and Lands for supplying Materials to be within any Parishes, Townships, or Places, inasmuch as those Awards were not in that respect expressly authorized by the recited Acts or any of them, and it is also apprehended that other Roads heretofore Part of those Fens may be extra-parochial: And whereas the Lands so set out for Materials are exhausted, or nearly so, or have otherwise become useless for the Purposes for which they were set out, and have for some Years past been in the Possession of the General Commissioners for Drainage by the River Witham, who now have in their Hands Monies arising from the Rents and Profits thereof up to the Sixth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, amounting to the Sum of Two hundred and seventy-seven Pounds Twelve Shillings and Sixpence: And whereas the Roads now used as public Roads in those Fens, or some of them, are in many Parts greatly in want of Repair, and it is expedient that better Provision be made for the Repair thereof, and in order thereto that they be declared to be within the several Parishes, Townships, or Places within which they were by those Awards respectively declared to be, or within the Ambit of which they

they are: And whereas the Act of the Sixth Year of William the Fourth, Chapter Fifty, intituled An Act to consolidate and amend 5 & 6 W. 4. the Laws relating to Highways in that Part of Great Britain called c. 50. England, and in this Act called the General Highways Act, is not at present in force within the Seven Townships formed under the fifthly recited Act, and it is expedient that that Act be executed within those Townships: And whereas such several Purposes cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows:

- I. That this Act may be cited for any Purpose as "The Wildmore Short Title. Fen and East and West Fens Highways Act, 1853."
- II. That this Act shall apply to the several Parishes, Townships, Limits of Act. and Places specified in the First Schedule.
- III. That the several Words and Expressions to which by the Same Mean-General Highways Act Meanings are assigned shall have in this Act ings to Words, &c. the same respective Meanings, unless there be in the Subject or in this Act Context something repugnant to or inconsistent with such Construction.

IV. That the Reverend $Henry\ Holdsworth$ of Fishtoft in the Trustees. County of Lincoln, Clerk, the Reverend George Coltman of Stickney in that County, Clerk, and Frederick Lyon Hopkins of Boston in that County, Esquire, and the Survivors and Survivor of them, shall be the Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and the several Powers of the Trustees under this Act may, while there are Three Trustees, be exercised by any Two of them.

V. That, except as by this Act expressly directed, the Trustees Powers of shall perform the Trusts of this Act in such Manner as they think Trustees. best, and shall have full Power, Authority, and Jurisdiction for performing those Trusts, and may make and give for the Performance thereof all such Orders, Directions, and Determinations as they think fit; and every such Order, Direction, and Determination, until it be revoked or altered by any subsequent Order, Direction, or Determination, shall be valid and effectual to all Intents and Purposes, and shall justify the Surveyors and all other Persons in giving Effect thereto; and the Trustees and every of them shall have the same or the like Indemnities with respect to their Acts and Proceedings whatsoever in performing those Trusts as are given to Commissioners in

and by the "Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," and all the Clauses of that Act with respect to the Liabilities of Commissioners, and the legal Proceedings by or against the Commissioners, shall be incorporated with and form Part of this Act: Provided always, that no Order, Direction, or Determination shall be revoked or altered to the Prejudice of any Person lawfully claiming any Benefit thereunder, without his Consent.

On Failure of Trustees, Justices to act.

VI. That if the Three Trustees in this Act named die, or become incapable or fail to act in the Trusts thereof, before those Trusts are fully performed, then those Trusts may and shall be performed by the Justices at Special Sessions of the Highways for the Soke of Bolingbroke in the Parts of Lindsey in the County of Lincoln, and the Provisions of this Act with respect to the Trustees shall apply to such Justices accordingly.

Public Roads in Fens to be Highways. VII. That the several Roads in Wildmore Fen and the East and West Fens respectively by the recited Awards respectively declared to be public Roads shall be Highways to be kept in repair by the respective Parishes in which they are, anything in the said recited Acts to the contrary notwithstanding.

As to public VIII. That such of the Highways in those Fens as by the recited Roads declared by Awards respectively were declared, whether by particular or by Awards to be general Terms, to be within any Parish, shall be in that Parish.

IX. That in every Case in which any Highway in those Fens passes over a Bridge, and the Lands at both Ends of the Bridge are in one and the same Parish, the Highway adjoining and over the Bridge shall be in that Parish.

As to Highways over Bridges between Two Parishes.

One Parish.

X. That in every Case in which any Highway in those Fens passes over a Bridge, and the Lands at one End of the Bridge are in one Parish, and the Lands at the other End of the Bridge are in another Parish, the Highway adjoining and over the Bridge shall be, as to One Half thereof transversely from the Centre of the Bridge, in each of those Parishes, and each Half shall be in the Parish by the Lands in which it is bounded.

XI. That every Township formed under the fifthly recited Act shall be for the Purposes of this Act a Parish maintaining its own Highways, and the "General Highways Act," and all other Acts amending or extending that Act, and relating generally to Highways in England, shall, subject to the Provisions of this Act, be in force and executed in and with respect to such Township accordingly.

XII. That as regards every Township formed under the fifthly First Election recited Act, the First Election or Appointment by Inhabitants under the "General Highways Act" of Surveyors shall take place within Thirty Days after the passing of this Act, and the subsequent Elec- 5 & 6 W. 4. tions or Appointments by Inhabitants shall take place on or within Fourteen Days after the Twenty-fifth Day of March in the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, and in every subsequent Year: Provided always, that the Provisions of this Act shall not restrict the Powers under the "General Highways Act" of Justices at Special Sessions for the Highways with respect to the Appointment of Surveyors.

XIII. Provided always, That nothing in this Act contained shall As to Reexonerate any County, Division of a County, Person, or Body Politic Bridges by or Corporate from any Liability to which they or he may now be sub- Counties. ject to repair and keep in repair the Walls, Banks, or Fences of the raised Causeways and raised Approaches to any Bridge erected since the passing of the "General Highways Act," or the Land Arches thereof, or to maintain or repair or to contribute towards the Maintenance or Repair of any Bridge in the Parishes specified in the First Schedule, or any of them, or the Walls, Banks, Fences, Causeways, Approaches, or Land Arches thereof, or any of them; nor shall anything in this Act contained extend to render liable any County, Division of a County, Person, or Body Politic or Corporate to the Repair or to contribute to the Repair of any such Bridge or Approaches to which such County, Division of a County, Person, or Body Politic or Corporate are not or have not heretofore been liable.

XIV. Provided always, That any Property in any of the Parishes Owners, &c. to which this Act applies, or any Owner or Occupier thereof, shall not be entitled to any Exemption from the Payment of any Highway Rate. Highway

XV. Provided always, That the recited Acts shall not be deemed Local or Personal Acts of Parliament within the Meaning of Section 113. of the General Highways Act, excepting certain Roads and Ways from that Act.

XVI. That no Person, after the passing of this Act, shall put Penalty for or cause or permit to be put any Geese into or upon any of the turning public Roads in the several Parishes to which this Act applies, or any Roads. of them, for the Purpose of wandering, straying, or lying, or being depastured thereon; and every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit a Sum not exceeding One Shilling, which shall be levied, recovered, and applied as a Penalty under the General Highways Act.

XVII. That it shall be lawful for the Surveyor of the Highways Power to of the Township of Midville, with the Consent of the Inhabitants construct 21 B [Local.]

and maintain

a Bridge across the Hobhole Drain. in Vestry assembled, with Notice of the Matter to be proposed, by and out of the Highway Rates of the said Township to erect and maintain a good and sufficient Bridge over and across the Hobhole Drain at the Western End of a certain public Road set out by the said Commissioners for the Inclosure of East and West Fens, and in their said Award called "The White Cross Clough Road," with a Carriage Road over the said Bridge of not less than Twenty Feet; and after the said Bridge shall have been erected, and so long as the same and the Road shall be kept in good and sufficient Repair, the said Inhabitants shall not be required to make or maintain so much of the Road set out by the said Commissioners along the West Bank of the said Hobhole Drain, and in their said Award called "The West Hobhole Road," as extends from the Bridge across Barlode Drain Southward to Fodder Dyke Road.

XVIII. That the Lands specified in the Second Schedule, and by the recited Awards declared to be in the Parishes in the Awards in that Behalf expressed, shall be in those Parishes respectively.

XIX. That the Lands specified in the Second Schedule shall from the passing of this Act be vested in the Surveyors of the Township or Hamlet of Frith Bank in the County of Lincoln, and their Successors; and the Surveyors of that Township or Hamlet shall, as soon as conveniently may be after the passing of this Act, sell and convey those Lands to some Person whose Lands adjoin thereto, or, if he refuse to purchase, to any other Person; and every such Conveyance may be made in the Form given in the Third Schedule to this Act, or to the like Effect, and every such Conveyance shall be valid and effectual to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever.

Sales to be made as Trustees, &c. determine.

XX. That such Sales and Conveyances shall be made by Public Auction or Private Contract, at such Times, for such Prices, on such Terms and Conditions, and in such Manner in all respects as the Trustees from Time to Time determine.

XXI. That the said Sum of Two hundred and seventy-seven Pounds Twelve Shillings and Sixpence received before the passing of this Act by the General Commissioners for Drainage by the River Witham in respect of the Rents and Profits of those Lands, and all Rents and Profits of those Lands which have accrued due since the Sixth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and which shall accrue due from the passing of this Act until such Sales thereof respectively be completed, shall be paid to such Persons as the Trustees from Time to Time determine, and may be recovered by such Persons in any Court of competent Jurisdiction, with full Costs of Suit, accordingly; and the Receipts of such Persons, and the Receipts

Receipts of the Surveyors, for the Purchase Monies for those Lands, shall be effectual Discharges for the Monies so paid to them respectively, and all Liability in respect thereof: Provided always, that the Payment by the said Commissioners of the said Sum of Two hundred and seventy-seven Pounds Twelve Shillings and Sixpence, and of such Sum and Sums of Money as have been received by them in respect of the Rents and Profits of those Lands which have accrued due since the Sixth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and fiftytwo, if any, shall be in full Discharge of their Liability under this Act in respect of such Rents and Profits.

XXII. That those Monies, Rents, Profits, and Purchase Monies, Application respectively shall be applied, under the Direction of the Trustees, first, in defraying the Costs and Expenses of and attending such Sales, and the obtaining of the Possession of the Lands sold, and the Recovery of the Monies; and secondly, in defraying the Costs, Charges, and Expenses whatsoever of and incident to the obtaining and passing of this Act, and the carrying of the several Purposes of this Act into execution; and the Surplus (if any) shall be applied for the Maintenance and Repair of Roads, as by this Act provided; and the Amount of such Costs, Charges, and Expenses respectively shall from Time to Time be ascertained and determined by the Trustees as they shall think fit.

" XXIII. That in order to determine how such surplus Monies Apportionshall be so applied, the Trustees shall first ascertain, in such Manner as they think fit, the Length of the Highways and private Roads in the several Parishes to which this Act applies, and which those Parishes Roads. or any Persons are in any way liable to repair, and shall then apportion those Monies rateably according to the respective Lengths of such Highways and private Roads, to be applied in and towards the repairing and maintaining of the same respectively, and shall determine by whom such Monies shall be so applied, and the same shall be applied accordingly.

XXIV. Provided always, That before apportioning such surplus Meeting for Monies, the Trustees shall give Fourteen Days public Notice of a Meeting to be held at Boston in the County of Lincoln, for the Purpose of receiving Claims in respect thereof.

XXV. Provided always, That the Monies to be so applied for Application the Repair of Highways shall be applied by the Surveyor of the of Monies by Parish to which they shall be apportioned.

XXVI. Provided always, That if the Monies so to be applied Surplus Moby the Surveyor of any Parish be more than is immediately required new in Hands for of Surveyors.

for the Repair of the Highways in that Parish, the Surplus thereof shall be carried to the Credit of the Highway Rates of that Parish.

Provision in case of Deficiency.

XXVII. That if the Monies, Rents, Profits, and Purchase Monies respectively to be applied under the Direction of the Trustees shall prove insufficient for defraying the Costs, Charges, and Expenses respectively to which they are by this Act made liable, the Amount of the Deficiency shall be raised as by this Act provided.

Deficiency to be raised by Acre Rate on Lands in Fens.

XXVIII. That the Amount so to be raised shall be raised by a Rate of an equal Amount for every Acre on all the Lands in the Wildmore Fen and the East and West Fens respectively, to be borne and paid by the Proprietors of such Lands.

Apportionment of Deficiency among Parishes.

XXIX. That in order to the raising of that Amount the Trustees shall apportion it between the several Parishes to which this Act applies, in proportion (or as nearly in proportion as conveniently may be) to the Extent in Acres of such Parts of those Parishes respectively as are within those Fens, and shall issue their Precepts to the several Surveyors of those Parishes respectively, requiring them (within a Time expressed in the Precepts) to raise the several Sums so apportioned.

Surveyors to XXX. That every such Surveyor shall, in pursuance of such Precept to him, make, assess, and levy on all the Lands in his respective Parish which are within those Fens a Rate sufficient to raise the Sum so apportioned to that Parish, and shall, at the Time in that Behalf expressed in the Precept so issued to him, pay that Sum to the Trustees, or to such Person as they appoint.

and to be Highway Rates.

XXXI. That every such Rate shall be a Highway Rate, and shall be made, assessed, levied, signed, allowed, published, added to, enforced, and recovered, and may be appealed against, and shall have all such other Incidents as if it were a Highway Rate under the "General Highways Act;" and the Powers and Provisions of that Act, but subject to the Powers and Provisions of this Act, apply thereto accordingly.

XXXII. Provided always, That any Surveyor, with the Consent with Consent of the Vestry of his respective Parish, may pay out of the ordinary Highway Rates of his respective Parish the apportioned Sum named in the Precept to him, instead of raising it by a Rate made by him under this Act.

Tenants may deduct Rates from Rent.

XXXIII. That any Tenant or Occupier of any Land in the Fens who pays any Sum in respect of any Rate made under this Act for the Purpose

Purpose of raising such Deficiency or any Part thereof, or who pays any Highway Rate out of which such Deficiency or any Part thereof is paid, may deduct from the Rent payable by him to his Landlord the Amount so contributed towards such Deficiency by such Tenant or Occupier: Provided also, that in every Case of a Difference as to the Amount which any such Tenant or Occupier may so deduct the Question may, on the Application of any Person interested, be referred to the Trustees, and their Decision thereon shall be final and conclusive on all Parties.

XXXIV. That the Surveyor of any Parish to which this Act applies, Power to with the Consent of the Inhabitants of that Parish in Vestry assem- borrow. bled, may from Time to Time, for the Purpose of remaking any of the public Roads in that Parish which are now gone to Decay, borrow at Interest, on the Security of Mortgages of the Highway Rates in that Parish, any Sums not exceeding the aggregate Amount of a Highway Rate of Seven Shillings and Sixpence in the Pound on that Parish, and may and shall from Time to Time raise by Highway Rates on that Parish, not exceeding in any One Year Two Shillings and Sixpence in the Pound, the Amount necessary for the Repayment of the Money so borrowed, and the Interest thereon, and the Monies so from Time to Time borrowed and raised shall be applied for the Purposes for which they are so borrowed and raised respectively.

XXXV. That the Provisions with respect to the Mortgages to be Certain Proexecuted by the Commissioners of "The Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847," apply, mutatis mutandis, to the Mortgages to be executed by the Surveyors.

XXXVI.. Provided always, That no Surveyor shall borrow any Restrictions such Money, except within Two Years after the passing of this Act, as to borand shall not borrow any Money for a longer Period than Seven Years, and shall not have any Power of reborrowing; and all the Money so borrowed, and the Interest thereon, shall be paid off within Nine Years after the passing of this Act: Provided also, that any Failure by a Surveyor to pay off any such Money or Interest shall not prejudice the Mortgage Security for the same, or preclude the Recovery thereof at any Time after Nine Years after the passing of this Act.

XXXVII. That the Trustees may from Time to Time employ such Employment Clerks, Surveyors, Officers, and others as they think requisite for the of Officers. Performance of the Trusts of this Act, and with such reasonable Remuneration as the Trustees think fit, and all Expenses incurred in that Behalf shall be Expenses of executing this Act.

Account of Receipts and Disburse-ments to be kept.

XXXVIII. That the Trustees shall, in Books to be kept for that Purpose by such Person as they may from Time to Time determine, cause true Accounts of all Monies received and expended by them under this Act, and of the Matters in respect of which they are received and expended, to be fairly entered; and such Books and Accounts shall at all reasonable Times be open to the Inspection of the Surveyors of the several Parishes to which this Act applies.

Publication of Accounts, &c.

XXXIX. That when the Trusts of this Act are performed the Trustees shall cause a full Abstract of such Accounts, certified by them to be correct, to be published in Two or more Newspapers published in the County of Lincoln, and circulating in the Parishes to which this Act applies, and shall cause all such Books and Accounts, and all Vouchers and Papers relating thereto, to be delivered to the Clerk of the Peace for the Parts of Lindsey in the County of Lincoln, and the same shall be received, retained, and dealt with by him according to the Act of the First Year of Her present Majesty, Chapter Eighty-three, as if they were specified in that Act.

Saving the Rights of the Duchy of Lancaster.

XL. That nothing in this Act contained (other than and except the several Provisions herein contained) shall extend to prejudice, diminish, alter, or take away any of the Rights, Privileges, Powers, or Authorities vested in or enjoyed by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, in right of Her Duchy of Lancaster.

For Protection of the Drainage by the River Witham in the County of Lincoln.

XLI. That in every Case where the Roads in the said Fens shall pass along and upon the Banks originally made for the Use of the Drainage under the Jurisdiction and Control of the General Commissioners for Drainage by the River Witham, the said General Commissioners shall have the same Rights, Interests, Powers, Privileges, and Authorities as heretofore enjoyed over all or any of the Banks upon which the Roads are formed, in depositing Excavations taken out of any of the Drains at and opposite the Roads, Care being taken to allow a free Passage along the Roads, as far as practicable, at the Time the Works are executing; and the said General Commissioners shall be at liberty and shall have full Power to cut through any Part of the Roads for the Purpose of making Culverts and Tunnels, or any other Works, for the Drainage of the Lands lying on the Land Side of the said Roads; and in case of any Slips arising in the Execution of Works of Drainage, so as to damage or injure the Road along and upon any of the Banks under the Jurisdiction of the said General Commissioners, then and in such Case the said General Commissioners shall restore, make good, and uphold such Banks to support the Road formed on the same.

XLII. That

XLII. That the whole of the Lands specified in the Second Lands sold Schedule of this Act, containing altogether Eighty-seven Acres Three Roods Eighteen Perches (more or less), shall when sold be subject to and chargeable with all Drainage Taxes and Charges authorized to be imposed thereon by virtue of any Act of Parliament now in force, or which shall hereafter be assessed or charged for Drainage Purposes upon the said Lands or any Part thereof; and that such Taxes and Charges, and any Penalties that may be incurred by Nonpayment thereof, shall be recoverable by Distress and Sale of any Goods and Chattels belonging to the Occupiers of the said Lands.
