

CHAPTER lxxxiii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local A.D. 1880. Government Board relating to the Rural Sanitary District of the Alnwick Union, the Borough of Barnsley (two), the Local Government District of Brentford, the Rural Sanitary District of the Durham Union, the Local Government Districts of Ealing, East Dereham, and Mountain Ash (two), the Boroughs of Newcastle-under-Lyme and Penzance, the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Rothbury and Settle Unions, and the Local Government District of Torquay. [2nd August 1880.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have, as regards the districts, boroughs, and city herein mentioned, made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provision herein contained should be enacted in reference to one of the said Districts:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Alnwick Union Order.

Provisional Order to enable the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of the Almwick Union to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Alnwick Union, in the County of Northumberland, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the Alnwick Union, in the County of Northumberland, as the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of constructing works of water supply for supplying the Township of Hedgeley, in their District, with water;

And whereas the said Sanitary Authority have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices, as required by the Public Health Act, 1875, and have presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement;

And whereas the Local Government Board, upon receipt of the said petition, directed Local Inquiry to be held as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer thereof, which Inquiry was held, after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Burnsley to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Barnsley, in the West Riding of the County of York, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Barnsley, in the West Riding of the County of York, acting by the Council, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto, for the purpose of widening, opening, enlarging, and improving a street called Kendray Street, and of constructing a new street, within the said Borough;

And whereas the said Council, as such Urban Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, have made due publication in the newspaper and served the several notices, as required by the Public Health Act, 1875, and have presented a petition to the Local Government Board, stating as required by that Act, and praying, with reference to the said lands, to be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869, with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement;

And whereas the Local Government Board, upon receipt of such petition, directed Local Inquiry to be held as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer

thereof, which Inquiry was held, after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

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Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Council, as such Urban Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869, with respect to the

BOROUGH OF BARNSLEY.

Provisional Order for altering certain Local Acts.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Barnsley, in the West Riding of the County of York, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Borough of Barnsley, in the West Riding of the County of York (herein-after referred to as "the Borough"), is an Urban Sanitary District, of which the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses, acting by the Council (herein-after referred to as "the Urban Sanitary Authority"), are the Urban Sanitary Authority, and the Barnsley Local Board Act, 1862, and the Barnsley Local

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Board Amendment Act, 1866, (herein-after jointly referred to as "the Local Acts," and severally referred to as "the Act of 1862" and "the Act of 1866," as the case may be,) are in force in the said District;

And whereas by Section 58 of the Act of 1862 it is enacted that the Urban Sanitary Authority (in the Local Acts called "the Local Board") may from time to time, under the authority of that Act, in addition to any moneys they have borrowed or are authorised to borrow under the Public Health Acts, borrow at interest, on mortgage of the water rates and other revenue of the Urban Sanitary Authority arising therefrom, and of the improvement rates, or of any of such securities, either together or separately, all such sums as they may from time to time think requisite for all or any of the purposes of that Act, not exceeding in the whole the sum of forty-nine thousand nine hundred pounds;

And whereas by Section 7 of the Act of 1866 it is enacted that the Urban Sanitary Authority may from time to time, under the authority of that Act, in addition to any moneys they have borrowed or are authorised to borrow under the Public Health Acts and under the Act of 1862, borrow at interest, on mortgage of the water rates and other revenue of the Urban Sanitary Authority arising therefrom, and of the improvement rate, as authorised by the Act of 1866, or of any of such securities, either together or separately, all such sums as they may from time to time think requisite for all or any of the purposes of the Act of 1862 and of the Act of 1866, not exceeding in the whole the sum of fifty thousand pounds;

And whereas by Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Government Board are empowered, on the application of the Sanitary Authority of any Sanitary District, by Provisional Order, wholly or partially to repeal, alter, or amend any Local Act, other than an Act for the conservancy of rivers, which is in force in any area comprising the whole or part of any such District, and not conferring powers or privileges on any persons or person for their or his own pecuniary benefit, which relates to the same subject-matters as the Public Health Act, 1875;

And whereas the Local Acts are Local Acts within the meaning of the above-recited section of the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Urban Sanitary Authority have applied to the Local Government Board to issue a Provisional Order to alter and amend the said Local Acts;

And whereas the Local Government Board, upon receipt of the said application, directed Local Inquiry to be held on the subject, which Inquiry was held, after due public notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, do hereby Order that, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order (herein-after referred to as "the commencement of this Order"), the following provisions shall take effect; viz.—

Art. I. Section 7 of the Act of 1866 shall be altered and amended so as to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority, subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board, to borrow, under the provisions thereof, on mortgage of the water rates and other revenue of the Urban Sanitary Authority arising therefrom, and of the improvement rate, or of any of such securities, either together

or separately, any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of twenty thousand pounds, in addition to the sum of fifty thousand pounds authorised to be borrowed by that section.

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Art. II. All mortgages granted by the Urban Sanitary Authority under the authority of the Local Acts, and subsisting at the commencement of this Order, shall, during the continuance of such mortgages, have priority over any mortgages granted by virtue of the powers of borrowing conferred by this Order.

Art. III. Sections 57, 59, and 60 of the Act of 1862, and Section 10 of the Act of 1866, shall not be applicable to any sums which, after the commencement of this Order, may be borrowed under Section 7 of the Act of 1866 as hereby altered and amended, but the provisions of Sub-sections 4 and 5 of Section 234, and of Sections 236, 237, 238, and 239 of the Public Health Act, 1875, shall apply to the borrowing and repayment of such sums as if they were borrowed under the provisions of that Act and not of the Act of 1866.

Art. IV. The Urban Sanitary Authority may from time to time re-borrow for the repayment of the moneys borrowed after the commencement of this Order under the Act of 1866 as hereby altered and amended.

Provided that any money so re-borrowed shall be repaid within the period within which the original loan in respect of which such moneys are re-borrowed would have been required to be repaid if such moneys had not been re-borrowed; and further, that no such re-borrowing shall affect the obligation of the Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to any sinking fund to be set aside, nor unless the re-borrowing be effected at different rate of interest, the amount of any instalment to be paid under the provisions of the Local Acts or this Order.

Art. V. Sections 9, 11, and 12 of the Act of 1866 shall be applicable to any sums which, after the commencement of this Order, may be borrowed under Section 7 of that Act as hereby altered and amended, and the provisions of Section 13 of the Act of 1866, with regard to the application of the moneys from time to time received by the Urban Sanitary Authority from the improvement rate, and of the water rates and other revenue from time to time received by them under the Barnsley Waterworks Act, 1853, and the Local Acts, in payment of the interest on the moneys borrowed by the Urban Sanitary Authority under the powers of the Local Acts and in liquidating the principal of such moneys, shall apply to the payment of the interest on moneys borrowed under the Act of 1866 as hereby altered and amended, and to the discharge, in accordance with the provisions of Sub-sections (4) and (5) of Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, of the principal of such last-mentioned moneys.

Art. VI. The Local Acts shall be further altered and amended so as to provide that—

(a.) The treasurer of the Urban Sanitary Authority shall, within twenty-one days after the expiration of each year during which any sum is required to be paid as an instalment, or to be set apart for a sinking fund, in respect of moneys borrowed under the Local Acts as hereby altered and amended, whether before or after the commencement

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of this Order, or in respect of moneys re-borrowed for the repayment of moneys so borrowed, transmit to the Local Government Board a return, in such form as may be prescribed by that Board, and verified by statutory declaration, if so required by them, showing the amounts which have been paid as instalments, and the amounts which have been invested or applied for the purposes of such sinking fund, during the year next preceding the making of such return, and the description of the securities upon which any investment has been made, and the purposes to which any portion of the sinking fund or investment, or of the sums accumulated by way of interest, has been applied during the same period, and the total amounts (if any) remaining invested at the end of the year.

(b.) If it appears to the Local Government Board, by that return or otherwise, that the Urban Sanitary Authority have failed to pay any instalment required to be paid, or to set apart any sum required for any sinking fund, or have applied any portion of the money set apart for any sinking fund, or of the sums accumulated by way of interest, to any purposes other than those authorised, they may, by Order, direct that a sum not exceeding double the amount in respect of which default has been made shall be paid by way of instalment, or be set apart and invested, or applied as part of the sinking fund; and any such Order shall be enforceable by writ of Mandamus, to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of Her Majesty's High Court of Justice.
