#### Assault

# 2 Assault by penetration

- (1) A person (A) commits an offence if—
  - (a) he intentionally penetrates the vagina or anus of another person (B) with a part of his body or anything else,
  - (b) the penetration is sexual,
  - (c) B does not consent to the penetration, and
  - (d) A does not reasonably believe that B consents.
- (2) Whether a belief is reasonable is to be determined having regard to all the circumstances, including any steps A has taken to ascertain whether B consents.
- (3) Sections 75 and 76 apply to an offence under this section.
- (4) A person guilty of an offence under this section is liable, on conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for life.

## 3 Sexual assault

- (1) A person (A) commits an offence if—
  - (a) he intentionally touches another person (B),
  - (b) the touching is sexual,
  - (c) B does not consent to the touching, and
  - (d) A does not reasonably believe that B consents.
