The Teaching Council (Scotland) (Disciplinary
Committee Assessor) Rules 1968*Made* - - - - 30th October 1968*Coming into Operation* 1st November 1968

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 10 of, and paragraph 3 of Schedule 2 to, the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965(a), I, Lord President of the Court of Session, hereby make the following Rules:—

1. In these Rules the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

- (i) "the Act" means the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965(a);
- (ii) "the Disciplinary Committee" means the Disciplinary Committee set up in terms of section 10 of the Act;
- (iii) "assessor" means an assessor appointed and acting in terms of paragraph 3 of Schedule 2 to the Act, for the purpose of advising the Disciplinary Committee on questions of law.

2. Where an assessor advises the Disciplinary Committee on any question of law as to evidence or procedure, either he shall do so in the presence of every party or person representing a party to the proceedings who appears thereat or, if the advice is tendered while the Disciplinary Committee is deliberating in private, every such party or person as aforesaid shall be informed what advice the assessor has tendered.

3. Every such party or person as aforesaid shall be informed if in any case the Disciplinary Committee does not accept the advice of the assessor on such a question as aforesaid.

4. These Rules may be cited as the Teaching Council (Scotland) (Disciplinary Committee Assessor) Rules 1968, and shall come into operation on 1st November 1968.
