ROAD TRAFFIC

The M4 Motorway (Rogiet Toll Plaza) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2009

Coming into force		-	13 November 2009

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M4 Motorway ("the M4"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road at Rogiet Toll Plaza in the County of Monmouthshire should be restricted because of the likelihood of danger to the public:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act $1984(\mathbf{a})$, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M4 Motorway (Rogiet Toll Plaza) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 13 November 2009.

2. In this Order –

"the M4" means the westbound carriageway of the M4 in the Toll Plaza area at the Second Severn Crossing between a point 752 metres west of the centre line of Station Road overbridge (near marker post 204/8) and a point 30 metres west of the centre line of Station Road overbridge (near marker post 204/1);

"the period of restriction" means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Monday 16 November 2009 and ending at 23.59 hours on 22 April 2011;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the period of restriction, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the M4.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes.
