Older children

35 Sexual exposure to an older child

- (1) If a person (“A”), who has attained the age of 16 years, intentionally and for a purpose mentioned in subsection (2) exposes A's genitals in a sexual manner to a child (“B”) who—
- (a) has attained the age of 13 years, but
 - (b) has not attained the age of 16 years,
- with the intention that B will see them, then A commits an offence, to be known as the offence of sexual exposure to an older child.
- (2) The purposes are—
- (a) obtaining sexual gratification,
 - (b) humiliating, distressing or alarming B.

Changes to legislation:

There are currently no known outstanding effects for the Sexual Offences (Scotland) Act 2009, Section 35.
