#### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Universal Credit (Managed Migration and Miscellaneous Amendments) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2020 and come into operation on 4th August 2020.

#### Amendment of the Universal Credit (Managed Migration and Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2019

**2.**—(1) The Universal Credit (Managed Migration and Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2019(**3**) are amended as follows.

(2) In paragraph (1) of regulation 4 (two week run-on of income-based jobseeker's allowance and income-related employment and support allowance: day appointed for abolition), after "beginning with the day" insert "after the day".
