The Additional Support for Learning (Sources of Information) (Scotland) Amendment Order 2011

Made - - - - 10th February 2011
Laid before the Scottish Parliament - - - - 15th February 2011
Coming into force - - 21st March 2011

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 26(2)(i) of the Education (Additional Support for Learning) (Scotland) Act 2004⁽¹⁾ and all other powers enabling them to do so.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Additional Support for Learning (Sources of Information) (Scotland) Amendment Order 2011 and comes into force on 21st March 2011.

Amendment of article 2 of the Additional Support for Learning (Sources of Information) (Scotland) Order 2010

2. In article 2(b) of the Additional Support for Learning (Sources of Information) (Scotland) Order 2010⁽²⁾, omit from “(a)” to “Limited.” and insert—

- “(a) Children in Scotland: Working for Children and Their Families, trading as “Enquire – the Scottish advice and information service for additional support for learning”, a charitable body registered in Scotland under registration number SC003527;
- (b) Scottish Independent Advocacy Alliance, a charitable body registered in Scotland under registration number SC033576; and
- (c) Scottish Child Law Centre, a charitable body registered in Scotland under registration number SCO12741.”.
