Citation and commencement, etc.

- **1.**—(1) This Act of Sederunt may be cited as the Act of Sederunt (Computer Evidence in the Sheriff Court) (Revocation) 2019.
 - (2) It comes into force on 5th March 2019.
 - (3) A certified copy is to be inserted in the Books of Sederunt.
