**The Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England  
and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2014**

*Made - - - - 2014  
Coming into force in accordance with regulation 1(2)*

The Lord President of the Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 9HE, 44 and 105 of the Local Government Act 2000(1), makes the following Regulations.

The Lord President of the Council has consulted the Electoral Commission about these Regulations in accordance with sections 9HE(4) and 44(3A) that Act.

In accordance with section 105(6) of that Act, a draft of these Regulations has been laid before and approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament.

**Citation, commencement, transition and interpretation**

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2014.

(2) These Regulations come into force on 6th April 2014 but have no effect in relation to any election in respect of which the date of the poll specified in the notice of election is on or before 21st May 2014.

(3) In these Regulations “the 2007 Regulations” means the Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England and Wales) Regulations 2007(2).

(4) In these Regulations, unless otherwise stated, any reference to a numbered regulation or Schedule is a reference to the regulation or Schedule bearing that number in the 2007 Regulations.

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- (1) [2000 c.22](#). Section 9HE was inserted by paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to the Localism Act 2011 ([c.20](#)); it is contained within Part 1A of the Local Government Act 2000, which deals with local authority governance in England. Sections 44(3A) and (3B) were inserted by Schedule 21 to the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000 ([c.41](#)); section 44 is contained within Part 2 of the Local Government Act 2000 which, as amended by the Localism Act 2011, deals with local authority governance in Wales. The powers conferred on the Secretary of State by section 44 were made exercisable concurrently by the Lord President of the Council and the Secretary of State by the Lord President of the Council Order 2010 ([S.I. 2010/1837](#)). The powers conferred on the Secretary of State by section 9HE were made exercisable concurrently by the Lord President of the Council and the Secretary of State by the Transfer of Functions (Elections and Referendums) Order 2013 ([S.I. 2013/2597](#)). Section 105 of the Local Government Act 2000 was amended by Schedule 4 and Schedule 25 to the Localism Act 2011.

## Revocations

2. The Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2012(3), and the amendments made to the 2007 Regulations by those Regulations, are revoked.

## Amendment of the Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England and Wales) Regulations 2007

3. In regulation 2 (interpretation), in the definition of “the Referendums Regulations” for “Local Authorities (Conduct of Referendums) (England) Regulations 2001” substitute “Local Authorities (Conduct of Referendums) (England) Regulations 2012”(4).

4. In regulation 5 (questioning of mayoral election) for “section 44(4)” substitute “sections 9HE(6) and 44(4)”.

5.—(1) Schedule 1 (the Mayoral Elections Rules) is amended as follows.

(2) In rule 3 (timetable), in the column of the table headed “Time”—

- (a) for the entry opposite “Delivery of nomination papers” substitute “Not later than 4 in the afternoon on the nineteenth day before the day of election”;
- (b) for the entry opposite “Publication of statement as to persons nominated” substitute “Not later than 4 in the afternoon on the eighteenth day before the day of election”; and
- (c) for the entry opposite “Delivery of notices of withdrawal of candidature” substitute “Not later than 4 in the afternoon on the nineteenth day before the day of election”.

(3) In rule 5(3) (notice of election) for “returning officer” substitute “registration officer”.

(4) In rule 9 (consent to nomination) for paragraph (b) substitute—

- “(b) is in the appropriate form in the Appendix or a form to the like effect and includes—
  - (i) for a nomination in England, a copy of sections 80 and 81 of the Local Government Act 1972(5), section 78A of the Local Government Act 2000(6) and section 34 of the Localism Act 2011(7); or
  - (ii) for a nomination in Wales, a copy of sections 80 and 81 of the Local Government Act 1972 and sections 78A and 79 of the Local Government Act 2000(8).”

(5) In rule 30 (notification of requirement of secrecy), make the existing provision paragraph (1) and after that paragraph insert—

“(5A) A postal ballot paper or postal voting statement that reaches the returning officer or a polling station on or after the close of the poll is treated for the purposes of this rule as reaching that officer or polling station before the close of the poll if it is delivered by a person who, at the close of the poll, is in the polling station, or in a queue outside the polling station, for the purpose of returning it.”

(9) In rule 54 (declaration of result), in paragraph (1) for “section 42(2)” substitute “section 9HC(2) or (3) or section 42(2) or (3)”.

(10) In the Appendix of Forms, in the “Form of Candidate’s Consent to Nomination”, for the words from “I declare that to the best of my knowledge” to “within the meaning of that Part”, substitute—

“\*For a nomination in England:

I declare that to the best of my knowledge and belief I am not disqualified for being elected by reason of any disqualification set out in, or decision made under, section 80 of the Local Government Act 1972, section 78A of the Local Government Act 2000 or section 34 of the Localism Act 2011 (copies of which are printed overleaf), and I do not hold a politically restricted post, within the meaning of Part 1 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, under a local authority, within the meaning of that Part.

\*For a nomination in Wales:

I declare that to the best of my knowledge and belief I am not disqualified for being elected by reason of any disqualification set out in, or decision made under, section 80 of the Local Government Act 1972 or section 78A or 79 of the Local Government Act 2000 (copies of which are printed overleaf), and I do not hold a politically restricted post, within the meaning of Part 1 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, under a local authority, within the meaning of that Part.

- (a) in the entry in column (2) opposite Section 39 (local elections void etc. in England and Wales), in the entry relating to subsection (6) before “Part 2” insert “Part 1A or”;
- (b) in the entry in column (2) opposite Section 47 (loan of equipment for local elections) before “Part II” insert “Part 1A or”;
- (c) for the entry in column (2), opposite Section 199B (translation of certain documents) substitute—

“In subsection (6), insert after paragraph (b)—

“(ba) in the case of an election for a mayor under the 2000 Act, must have printed at the top of the list of candidates the words “Vote (x) for one candidate only” if there are only two candidates, or the words “Vote once (x) in column 1 for your first choice, and Vote once (x) in column 2 for your second choice” if there are more than two candidates;”.”; and”

- (d) in the entry in column (2) opposite Section 203 (local government provisions as to England and Wales) before “Part II” insert “Part 1A or”.

(4) In Table 4 (The Representation of the People (England and Wales) Regulations 2001)—

- (a) in the entry in column (2) opposite Regulation 3 (interpretation) before “Part 2” insert “Part 1A or”; and
- (b) in the entry in column (2) opposite Regulation 64 (interpretation of Part 5) before “Part 2” insert “Part 1A or”.

7.—(1) Schedule 3 (the Mayoral Election (Combination of Polls) Rules) is amended as follows.

(2) In rule 3 (timetable), in the column of the table headed “Time”—

- (a) for the entry opposite “Delivery of nomination papers” substitute “Not later than 4 in the afternoon on the nineteenth day before the day of election”;
- (b) for the entry opposite “Publication of statement as to persons nominated” substitute “Not later than 4 in the afternoon on the eighteenth day before the day of election”; and
- (c) for the entry opposite “Delivery of notices of withdrawal of candidate” substitute “Not later than 4 in the afternoon on the nineteenth day before the day of election”.

(3) In rule 5(3) (notice of election) for “returning officer” substitute “registration officer”.

(4) In rule 9 (consent to nomination) for paragraph (b) substitute—

“(b) is in the appropriate form in the Appendix or a form to the like effect and includes—

(i) for a nomination in England, a copy of sections 80 and 81 of the Local Government Act 1972, section 78A of the Local Government Act 2000 and section 34 of the Localism Act 2011; or

(ii) for a nomination in Wales, a copy of sections 80 and 81 of the Local Government Act 1972 and sections 78A and 79 of the Local Government Act 2000.”

(5) For rule 28(10) (equipment of polling stations) substitute the following—

“(10) In every compartment of every polling station there must be exhibited the notice:

“PARLIAMENTARY ELECTION

(*[Specify colour]* ballot paper)

Vote for ONLY ONE CANDIDATE by putting a cross [X] in the box next to your choice.

\*EUROPEAN PARLIAMENTARY ELECTION

(*[Specify colour]* ballot paper)

Vote ONLY ONCE by putting a cross [X] in the box next to your choice.

\**[Specify name of council]* COUNCIL ELECTION

(*[Specify colour]* ballot paper)

- (e) Form 8 (official poll card);
- (f) Form 9 (official postal poll card);
- (g) Form 10 (official proxy poll card);
- (h) Form 11 (official proxy postal poll card);
- (i) Form 12 (directions for the guidance of voters);
- (j) Form 13 (certificate of employment); and
- (k) Form 14 (declaration to be made by the companion of a voter with disabilities).

#### Directions as to printing the ballot paper

1. Nothing is to be printed on the ballot paper except in accordance with these directions.
2. So far as is practicable, the arrangements set out in paragraphs 3 to 5 must be observed in the printing of the ballot paper.
3. No word may be printed on the face except:
  - a. the heading "Election of the Mayor for ....."
  - b. within that heading, the name of the local authority
  - c. the direction "Vote [X] for one candidate only"
  - d. the particulars of the candidates and words forming part of emblems mentioned at paragraphs 6 and 7 below.
4. No rule may be printed on the face except:
  - a. as part of a box around the direction mentioned in paragraph 3b
  - b. the horizontal rule separating the direction mentioned in paragraph 3b from the particulars of the candidates
  - c. the horizontal rules separating the particulars of the candidates from one another
  - d. a final horizontal rule at the foot of the ballot paper
  - e. as part of the boxes on the right-hand side of the ballot paper where the vote is to be marked.
5. The space between the horizontal rules mentioned in paragraphs 4b and 4d is to be equally divided between each of the candidates by the horizontal rules mentioned in paragraph 4c.
6. The surname of each candidate is to be printed in large bold capitals, with their forename(s) and other particulars set out in ordinary type, except that small capitals are to be used:
  - a. if the surname is the same as another candidate's, for their forename(s)
  - b. if the forename(s) are also the same as the other candidate's, either for their home address or for their description unless each of them is the same as that of another candidate with the same surname and forename(s).
7. Where an emblem is to be printed against a candidate's particulars:
  - a. it is to be printed along the horizontal rule to the right of the candidate's particulars and to the left of the box where the vote is to be marked
  - b. its size as printed must not exceed two centimetres square.
8. The number and other unique identifying mark must be printed on the back of the ballot paper.

#### Directions as to printing the ballot paper

1. Nothing is to be printed on the ballot paper except in accordance with these directions.
2. So far as is practicable, the arrangements set out in paragraphs 3 to 6 must be observed in the printing of the ballot paper.
3. No word may be printed on the face except:
  - a. the heading "Election of the Mayor for ....."
  - b. within that heading, the name of the local authority
  - c. the direction "Vote once [X] in column 1 for your first choice, and Vote once [X] in column 2 for your second choice"
  - d. the indicators "Column 1 first choice" and "Column 2 second choice"
  - e. the particulars of the candidates and words forming part of emblems mentioned at paragraphs 7 and 8 below.
4. No rule may be printed on the face except:
  - a. as part of a box around the direction mentioned in paragraph 3b
  - b. the horizontal rule separating the direction mentioned in paragraph 3b from the particulars of the candidates
  - c. the horizontal rules separating the particulars of the candidates from one another
  - d. a final horizontal rule at the foot of the ballot paper
  - e. as part of the boxes in column 1 and column 2 on the right-hand side of the ballot paper where the vote is to be marked.
5. The space between the horizontal rules mentioned in paragraphs 4b and 4d is to be equally divided between each of the candidates by the horizontal rules mentioned in paragraph 4c.
6. The boxes in columns 1 and 2 mentioned in paragraph 4e must each be bordered by a shaded area no more than 0.4 cm thick at the outside edge. Each shaded area must include an embedded arrow pointing downwards from the top of the column underneath the indicators mentioned at paragraph 3c and above the top boxes referred to in paragraph 4e.
7. The surname of each candidate is to be printed in large bold capitals, with their forename(s) and other particulars set out in ordinary type, except that small capitals are to be used:
  - a. if the surname is the same as another candidate's, for their forename(s)
  - b. if the forename(s) are also the same as the other candidate's, either for their home address or for their description unless each of them is the same as that of another candidate with the same surname and forename(s).
8. Where an emblem is to be printed against a candidate's particulars:
  - a. it is to be printed along the horizontal rule to the right of the candidate's particulars and to the left of the box in column 1

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**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations make changes to the Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England and Wales) Regulations 2007 (S.I. 2007/1024) (the “2007 Regulations”).

Regulation 2 revokes the Local Authorities (Mayoral Elections) (England and Wales) Regulations 2012 (S.I. 2012/2059) and the amendments made to the 2007 Regulations by those Regulations.

Regulations 5 and 7 amend Schedules 1 (“the Mayoral Election Rules”) and 3 (“the Mayoral Election (Combination of Polls) Rules”) to the 2007 Regulations. Regulations 5(2) and 7(2) amend the

Mayoral Elections Rules and the Mayoral Elections (Combination of Polls) Rules to change the deadline for candidates to withdraw at local mayoral elections, including when combined with another poll. Regulations 5(3) and 7(3) correct a minor error in rule 5(3) of the Mayoral Elections Rules and in rule 5(3) of the Mayoral Elections (Combination of Polls) Rules, by replacing a reference to “returning officer” with “registration officer”.

Regulations 5(5) and (6) and 7(6) and (7) make changes to rules 30 and 32 of the Mayoral Elections Rules and the Mayoral Election (Combination of Polls) Rules to provide that certain references to police constables in those rules include references to community support officers. This ensures that the changes made by the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013 (c.6) to the parliamentary elections rules in the Representation of the People Act 1983 (c. 2) are reflected for mayoral elections.

Regulations 5(7) and (8) and 7(8) and (9)(b) make changes to the Mayoral Elections Rules and the Mayoral Election (Combination of Polls) Rules to reflect the changes made to parliamentary elections rules by the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013 and the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013 (Commencement No.4 and Consequential Provision) Order 2013 to allow voters queuing at a polling station at the close of the poll (10pm on polling day) to be issued with ballot papers and vote, or to return postal ballot papers and voting statements.

Regulations 5(4) and (10) and 7(4) and (11) make amendments to rule 9 (consent to nomination) and the corresponding form (Form of Candidate’s Consent to Nomination) for Mayoral Elections Rules and the Mayoral Election (Combination of Polls) Rules to update statutory references to legislation governing disqualification.

Regulations 5(11) and 7(12) and Schedules 1 and 2 replace certain forms in the Mayoral Elections Rules and the Mayoral Election (Combination of Polls) Rules.

Regulation 3 updates the interpretation regulation in the 2007 Regulations. Regulations 4, 5(9), 7(9)(a) and (10) and 8, make consequential changes to the 2007 Regulations, updating statutory references to reflect modifications made to the Local Government Act 2000 by the Localism Act 2011. Regulation 6(2) and (3), make amendments to Schedule 2 to the 2007 Regulations, to update statutory references. Regulation 6(3)(c) modifies the application of section 199B (translation etc. of certain documents) of the Representation of the People Act 1983 to mayoral elections, altering the words that will appear on an enlarged version of the mayoral ballot paper displayed at polling stations. Regulation 7(5) modifies rule 28(10) of the Mayoral Election (Combination of Polls) Rules which sets out guidance for voters in combined polls.

A full impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument because no, or no significant, impact on the private, voluntary or public sectors is foreseen other than that set out in the impact assessments which relate to Part 2 of the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013.
