# [F1 F2 Jurisdiction: general. E+W

- (1) A court in England and Wales shall not make a section 1(1)(a) order with respect to a child unless—
  - (a) it has jurisdiction under  $^{F3}...[^{F4}$  the Hague Convention], or
  - (b) [F5the Hague Convention does not apply] but—
    - (i) the question of making the order arises in or in connection with matrimonial proceedings [F6 or civil partnership proceedings] and the condition in section 2A of this Act is satisfied, or
    - (ii) the condition in section 3 of this Act is satisfied.]
- [A court in England and Wales shall not have jurisdiction to make a special <sup>F7</sup>(2A) guardianship order under the Children Act 1989 unless the condition in section 3 of this Act is satisfied.
  - (2B) A court in England and Wales shall not have jurisdiction to make an order under section 26 of the Adoption and Children Act 2002 unless the condition in section 3 of this Act is satisfied.
- [ A court in England and Wales shall not have jurisdiction to make an order under  $^{F8}(2C)$  section 51A of the Adoption and Children Act 2002 unless—
  - (a) it has jurisdiction under <sup>F9</sup>... the Hague Convention, or
  - (b) [F10the Hague Convention does not apply] but the condition in section 3 of this Act is satisfied.]

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# [F152A Jurisdiction in or in connection with matrimonial proceedings [F16 or civil partnership proceedings]. E+W

- (1) The condition referred to in section 2(1) of this Act is that the F17... proceedings are proceedings in respect of the marriage [F18 or civil partnership] of the parents of the child concerned and—
  - (a) the proceedings—
    - (i) are proceedings for divorce or nullity of marriage [F19, or dissolution or annulment of a civil partnership], and
    - (ii) are continuing;
  - (b) the proceedings—
    - (i) are proceedings for judicial separation [F20 or legal separation of civil partners],
    - (ii) are continuing,

and the jurisdiction of the court is not excluded by subsection (2) below; or

- (c) the proceedings have been dismissed after the beginning of the trial but—
  - (i) the section 1(1)(a) order is being made forthwith, or
  - (ii) the application for the order was made on or before the dismissal.
- [F21(2) For the purposes of subsection (1)(b) above, the jurisdiction of the court is excluded if—
  - (a) after the grant of a decree of judicial separation [F22] or the making of a judicial separation order], on the relevant date, proceedings for divorce or nullity in respect of the marriage, or
  - (b) after the making of a separation order, on the relevant date, proceedings for dissolution or annulment in respect of the civil partnership,

are continuing in Scotland or Northern Ireland.]

- (3) Subsection (2) above shall not apply if the court in which the other proceedings there referred to are continuing has made—
  - (a) an order under section 13(6) or [F2319A(4)] of this Act (not being an order made by virtue of section 13(6)(a)(i)), or
  - (b) an order under section 14(2) or 22(2) of this Act which is recorded as being made for the purpose of enabling Part I proceedings to be taken in England and Wales with respect to the child concerned.

  - (a) has jurisdiction to make a section 1(1)(a) order [F24by virtue of section 2(1) (b)(i) of this Act], but
  - (b) considers that it would be more appropriate for Part I matters relating to the child to be determined outside England and Wales,

the court may by order direct that, while the order under this subsection is in force, no section 1(1)(a) order shall be made by any court [F25by virtue of section 2(1)(b) (i) of this Act].]

# 3 Habitual residence or presence of child. E+W

- (1) The condition referred to in [F26 section 2(1)(b)(ii)] of this Act is that on the relevant date the child concerned—
  - (a) is habitually resident in England and Wales, or
  - (b) is present in England and Wales and is not habitually resident in any part of the United Kingdom,

and, in either case, the jurisdiction of the court is not excluded by subsection (2) below.

- (2) For the purposes of subsection (1) above, the jurisdiction of the court is excluded if, on the relevant date, [F27 matrimonial proceedings] [F28 or civil partnership proceedings] are continuing in a court in Scotland or Northern Ireland in respect of the marriage [F29 or civil partnership] of the parents of the child concerned.
- (3) Subsection (2) above shall not apply if the court in which the other proceedings there referred to are continuing has made—
  - (a) an order under section 13(6) or [F3019A(4)] of this Act (not being an order made by virtue of section 13(6)(a)(i)), or
  - (b) an order under section 14(2) or 22(2) of this Act which is recorded as made for the purpose of enabling [F31Part I proceedings with respect to] the child concerned to be taken in England and Wales,

## 5 Power of court to refuse application or stay proceedings. E+W

- (1) A court in England and Wales which has jurisdiction to make a [F34Part I order] may refuse an application for the order in any case where the matter in question has already been determined in proceedings outside England and Wales.
- (2) Where, at any stage of the proceedings on an application made to a court in England and Wales for a [F34Part I order], or for the variation of a [F34Part I order], it appears to the court—
  - (a) that proceedings with respect to the matters to which the application relates are continuing outside England and Wales, <sup>F36</sup>...
  - (b) that it would be more appropriate for those matters to be determined in proceedings to be taken outside England and Wales, [F37 or]
  - F38(c) .....
  - [F39( d) that it should exercise its powers under Article 8 of the Hague Convention (request to authority in another Contracting State to assume jurisdiction),]

the court may stay the proceedings on the application [ $^{F40}$ or (as the case may be) exercise its powers under  $^{F41}$ ... [ $^{F42}$  Article 8 of the Hague Convention]].

[F43(2A)] If the proceedings on the application are proceedings in which [F44an] activity direction has been made under section 11A of the Children Act 1989 (or an enforcement order has been made under section 11J of that Act), the court may when granting a stay under or by virtue of subsection (2) also suspend [F45the] activity direction (or the enforcement order).]

(3) The court may remove a stay granted [F46by virtue of subsection (2)(a) or (b) above] if it appears to the court that there has been unreasonable delay in the taking or prosecution of the other proceedings referred to in that subsection, or that those proceedings are stayed, sisted or concluded.

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- [F48(3AA)] The court may remove a stay granted in order for it to exercise its powers under Article 8 of the Hague Convention, and withdraw any request made by it to an authority in another Contracting State to assume jurisdiction, if—
  - (a) the authority in the other Contracting State does not assume jurisdiction within the period for which the court granted the stay, or
  - (b) the parties do not, within the period specified by the court, request the authority in the other Contracting State to assume jurisdiction.]

## 6 Duration and variation of custody orders. E+W

- (1) [F56Part I order] made by a court in Scotland or Northern Ireland (or a variation of such an order) comes into force with respect to a child at a time when a [F56Part I order] made by a court in England and Wales has effect with respect to him, the latter order shall cease to have effect so far as it makes provision for any matter for which the same or different provision is made by (or by the variation of) the order made by the court in Scotland or Northern Ireland.
- (2) Where by virtue of subsection (1) above a [F56Part I order] has ceased to have effect so far as it makes provision for any matter, a court in England or Wales shall not have jurisdiction to vary that order so as to make provision for that matter.
- [F57(3) A court in England and Wales shall not have jurisdiction to vary a Part I order if, on the relevant date, matrimonial proceedings [F58 or civil partnership proceedings] are continuing in Scotland or Northern Ireland in respect of the marriage [F59 or civil partnership] of the parents of the child concerned.

## [<sup>F60</sup>(3A) Subsection (3) shall not apply if—

- (a) the Part 1 order was made in or in connection with proceedings—
  - (i) for divorce or nullity in England and Wales in respect of the marriage of the parents of the child concerned; or
  - (ii) for dissolution or annulment in England and Wales in respect of the civil partnership of the parents of the child concerned; and
- (b) those proceedings are continuing.]

## [<sup>F60</sup>(3B) Subsection (3) shall not apply if—

- (a) the Part 1 order was made in or in connection with proceedings—
  - (i) for judicial separation in England and Wales; or
  - (ii) for a separation order in England and Wales; and
- (b) those proceedings are continuing; and
- (c) as the case may be, the [F61 judicial separation order] or the separation order has not yet been made.]]
- (4) Subsection (3) above shall not apply if the court in which the proceedings there referred to are continuing has made—
