



# Child Support Act 1991

## 1991 CHAPTER 48

### *The basic principles*

#### **1 The duty to maintain.**

- (1) For the purposes of this Act, each parent of a qualifying child is responsible for maintaining him.
- (2) For the purposes of this Act, [<sup>F1</sup>a non-resident parent] shall be taken to have met his responsibility to maintain any qualifying child of his by making periodical payments of maintenance with respect to the child of such amount, and at such intervals, as may be determined in accordance with the provisions of this Act.
- (3) Where a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] made under this Act requires the making of periodical payments, it shall be the duty of the [<sup>F1</sup>non-resident parent] with respect to whom the [<sup>F3</sup>calculation] was made to make those payments.

## 2 Welfare of children: the general principle.

Where, in any case which falls to be dealt with under this Act, the [<sup>F4</sup>Secretary of State]<sup>F5</sup>... is considering the exercise of any discretionary power conferred by this Act, [<sup>F6</sup>the Secretary of State] shall have regard to the welfare of any child likely to be affected by [<sup>F7</sup>the] decision.

## 3 Meaning of certain terms used in this Act.

- (1) A child is a “qualifying child” if—
  - (a) one of his parents is, in relation to him, [<sup>F1</sup>a non-resident parent]; or
  - (b) both of his parents are, in relation to him, [<sup>F1</sup>non-resident parents].
- (2) The parent of any child is [<sup>F1</sup>a “non-resident parent”], in relation to him, if—
  - (a) that parent is not living in the same household with the child; and
  - (b) the child has his home with a person who is, in relation to him, a person with care.
- (3) A person is a “person with care”, in relation to any child, if he is a person—
  - (a) with whom the child has his home;
  - (b) who usually provides day to day care for the child (whether exclusively or in conjunction with any other person); and
  - (c) who does not fall within a prescribed category of person.
- (4) The Secretary of State shall not, under subsection (3)(c), prescribe as a category—
  - (a) parents;
  - (b) guardians;
  - [<sup>F8</sup>(c) persons named, in a child arrangements order under section 8 of the Children Act 1989, as persons with whom a child is to live;]
  - (d) in Scotland, persons [<sup>F9</sup>with whom a child is to live by virtue of a residence order under section 11 of the Children (Scotland) Act 1995.]
- (5) For the purposes of this Act there may be more than one person with care in relation to the same qualifying child.

## 4 Child support maintenance.

- (1) A person who is, in relation to any qualifying child or any qualifying children, either the person with care or the [<sup>F1</sup>non-resident parent] may apply to the [<sup>F10</sup>Secretary of State] for a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] to be made under this Act with respect to that child, or any of those children.
- (2) Where a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] has been made in response to an application under this section the [<sup>F11</sup>Secretary of State] may, if the person with care [<sup>F12</sup>... applies to [<sup>F11</sup>the Secretary of State] under this subsection, arrange for—
- the collection of the child support maintenance payable in accordance with the [<sup>F3</sup>calculation];
  - the enforcement of the obligation to pay child support maintenance in accordance with the [<sup>F3</sup>calculation].
- [<sup>F13</sup>(2A) The [<sup>F14</sup>Secretary of State] may only make arrangements under subsection (2)(a) if—
- the non-resident parent agrees to the arrangements, or

- (b) the [F14Secretary of State] is satisfied that without the arrangements child support maintenance is unlikely to be paid in accordance with the calculation.]
- (3) Where an application under subsection (2) for the enforcement of the obligation mentioned in subsection (2)(b) authorises the [F15Secretary of State] to take steps to enforce that obligation whenever [F15the Secretary of State] considers it necessary to do so, the [F15Secretary of State] may act accordingly.
- (4) A person who applies to the [F16Secretary of State] under this section shall, so far as that person reasonably can, comply with such regulations as may be made by the Secretary of State with a view to the [F16Secretary of State]F17... being provided with the information which is required to enable—
  - (a) the [F1non-resident parent] to be [F18identified or] traced (where that is necessary);
  - (b) the amount of child support maintenance payable by the [F1non-resident parent] to be assessed; and
  - (c) that amount to be recovered from the [F1non-resident parent].
- (5) Any person who has applied to the [F19Secretary of State] under this section may at any time request [F19the Secretary of State] to cease acting under this section.
- (6) It shall be the duty of the [F20Secretary of State] to comply with any request made under subsection (5) (but subject to any regulations made under subsection (8)).
- (7) The obligation to provide information which is imposed by subsection (4)—
  - (a) shall not apply in such circumstances as may be prescribed; and
  - (b) may, in such circumstances as may be prescribed, be waived by the [F21Secretary of State].
- (8) The Secretary of State may by regulations make such incidental, supplemental or transitional provision as he thinks appropriate with respect to cases in which he is requested to cease to act under this section.

## 5 Child support maintenance: supplemental provisions.

- (1) Where—
- (a) there is more than one person with care of a qualifying child; and
  - (b) one or more, but not all, of them have parental responsibility for <sup>F29</sup>... the child;
- no application may be made for a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] with respect to the child by any of those persons who do not have parental responsibility for <sup>F29</sup>... the child.
- (2) Where more than one application for a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] is made with respect to the child concerned, only one of them may be proceeded with.
- (3) The Secretary of State may by regulations make provision as to which of two or more applications for a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] with respect to the same child is to be proceeded with.

## 7 **Right of child in Scotland to apply for [F<sup>3</sup> calculation].**

(1) A qualifying child who has attained the age of 12 years and who is habitually resident in Scotland may apply to the [F<sup>31</sup>Secretary of State] for a [F<sup>2</sup>maintenance calculation] to be made with respect to him if—

(a) no such application has been made by a person who is, with respect to that child, a person with care or [F<sup>1</sup>a non-resident parent]; F<sup>32</sup>...

(2) An application made under subsection (1) shall authorise the [F<sup>31</sup>Secretary of State] to make a [F<sup>2</sup>maintenance calculation] with respect to any other children of the [F<sup>1</sup>non-resident parent] who are qualifying children in the care of the same person as the child making the application.

(3) Where a [F<sup>2</sup>maintenance calculation] has been made in response to an application under this section the [F<sup>33</sup>Secretary of State] may, if the [F<sup>34</sup>person with care or] the child concerned applies to [F<sup>33</sup>the Secretary of State] under this subsection, arrange for—

(a) the collection of the child support maintenance payable in accordance with the [F<sup>3</sup> calculation];

(b) the enforcement of the obligation to pay child support maintenance in accordance with the [F<sup>3</sup> calculation].

[F<sup>35</sup>(3A) The [F<sup>36</sup>Secretary of State] may only make arrangements under subsection (3)(a) if—

(a) the non-resident parent agrees to the arrangements, or

(5) Where a child has asked the [F<sup>38</sup>Secretary of State] to proceed under this section, the person with care of the child, the [F<sup>1</sup>non-resident parent] and the child concerned shall, so far as they reasonably can, comply with such regulations as may be made by the Secretary of State with a view to the [F<sup>38</sup>Secretary of State] F<sup>39</sup>... being provided with the information which is required to enable—

(a) the [F<sup>1</sup>non-resident parent] to be traced (where that is necessary);

(b) the amount of child support maintenance payable by the [F<sup>1</sup>non-resident parent] to be assessed; and

(c) that amount to be recovered from the [F<sup>1</sup>non-resident parent].

(6) The child who has made the application (but not the person having care of him) may at any time request the [F<sup>40</sup>Secretary of State] to cease acting under this section.

## **8 Role of the courts with respect to maintenance for children.**

- (1) This subsection applies in any case where [<sup>F47</sup>the [<sup>F48</sup>Secretary of State]] would have jurisdiction to make a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] with respect to a qualifying child and [<sup>F1</sup>a non-resident parent] of his on an application duly made <sup>F49</sup>... by a person entitled to apply for such [<sup>F3</sup>a calculation] with respect to that child.

## 9 Agreements about maintenance.

- (1) In this section “maintenance agreement” means any agreement for the making, or for securing the making, of periodical payments by way of maintenance, or in Scotland aliment, to or for the benefit of any child.
- (2) Nothing in this Act shall be taken to prevent any person from entering into a maintenance agreement.

**10 Relationship between maintenance [<sup>F3</sup>calculations] and certain court orders and related matters.**

- (1) Where an order of a kind prescribed for the purposes of this subsection is in force with respect to any qualifying child with respect to whom a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] is made, the order—
- (a) shall, so far as it relates to the making or securing of periodical payments, cease to have effect to such extent as may be determined in accordance with regulations made by the Secretary of State; or
  - (b) where the regulations so provide, shall, so far as it so relates, have effect subject to such modifications as may be so determined.
- (2) Where an agreement of a kind prescribed for the purposes of this subsection is in force with respect to any qualifying child with respect to whom a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] is made, the agreement—
- (a) shall, so far as it relates to the making or securing of periodical payments, be unenforceable to such extent as may be determined in accordance with regulations made by the Secretary of State; or
  - (b) where the regulations so provide, shall, so far as it so relates, have effect subject to such modifications as may be so determined.
- (3) Any regulations under this section may, in particular, make such provision with respect to—
- (a) any case where any person with respect to whom an order or agreement of a kind prescribed for the purposes of subsection (1) or (2) has effect applies to the prescribed court, before the end of the prescribed period, for the order or agreement to be varied in the light of the [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] and of the provisions of this Act;
  - (b) the recovery of any arrears under the order or agreement which fell due before the coming into force of the [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation],

as the Secretary of State considers appropriate and may provide that, in prescribed circumstances, an application to any court which is made with respect to an order of a prescribed kind relating to the making or securing of periodical payments to or for

the benefit of a child shall be treated by the court as an application for the order to be revoked.

- (4) The Secretary of State may by regulations make provision for—
- (a) notification to be given by [<sup>F67</sup>the [<sup>F68</sup>Secretary of State]] to the prescribed person in any case where [<sup>F68</sup>the Secretary of State] considers that the making of a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] has affected, or is likely to affect, any order of a kind prescribed for the purposes of this subsection;
  - (b) notification to be given by the prescribed person to the [<sup>F69</sup>Secretary of State] in any case where a court makes an order which it considers has affected, or is likely to affect, a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation].
- (5) Rules [<sup>F70</sup>of court may require] any person who, in prescribed circumstances, makes an application to [<sup>F71</sup>the family court] for a maintenance order to furnish the court with a statement in a prescribed form, and signed by [<sup>F72</sup>an officer of the [<sup>F73</sup>Secretary of State]], as to whether or not, at the time when the statement is made, there is a [<sup>F2</sup>maintenance calculation] in force with respect to that person or the child concerned.
