ARTICLES OF WAR

Miscellaneous offences

39 Conduct to the prejudice of naval discipline.

Every person subject to this Act who is guilty [^{F1}whether by any act or omission or otherwise, of conduct] to the prejudice of good order and naval discipline . . . ^{F2} shall be liable to [^{F3}imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years] or any less punishment authorised by this Act.
