The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 2(1) and 26(1) of the County Courts Act 1984(1), section 99(1) of the Supreme Court Act 1981(2), section 33(1) of the Matrimonial and Family Proceedings Act 1984(3), section 67(1) and (2) of the Race Relations Act 1976(4) and sections 117(4) and 374 of the Insolvency Act 1986(5) hereby makes the following Order—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Civil Courts (Amendment) Order 1998 and shall come into force on 7th September 1998.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, "the 1983 Order" means the Civil Courts Order 1983(6), and a Schedule referred to by number alone means the Schedule so numbered in that Order.

Amendments to the 1983 Order

- 3. In Schedule 1-
 - (a) "Holywell" shall be deleted from its position in the second column opposite the entry for "Rhyl" in the first column; and
 - (b) the entry relating to Rochdale shall be deleted.
