EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order amends the Plant Health (England) Order 2005 ([S.I. 2005/2530](#)) (“the principal Order”) so as to implement the instruments below—

This Order makes provision for a purpose mentioned in section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 ([c. 68](#)) and references to the Decisions listed in (a), (b), (c) and (d) are to be construed as references to those instruments as amended from time to time.

Articles 3, 4 and 5 make various amendments to Schedules 1, 4, 5, 6 and 7 to the principal Order so as to apply the restrictions on the landing in and movement within England of certain plant material (described in each article) from third countries and other parts of the European Community and the requirements for phytosanitary certificates and plant passports to the plant material listed in order to prevent the introduction into and spread within England of, respectively, the following plant pests: *Rhynchophorus ferrugineus* (Olivier), *Gibberella circinata* Nirenberg & O’Donnell, Potato spindle tuber viroid.

Article 6 amends Schedule 4 to the principal Order so as to apply special requirements in respect of certain citrus fruits originating in Brazil.

Article 7 amends the definition of “Directive [2000/29/EC](#)” so as to incorporate within it Commission Directive [2007/41/EC](#) and adds *Vitis* L. to the list of plants in Part B of Schedule 7 to the principal Order requiring a plant passport if they are to be consigned to a protected zone in another part of the European Community.

A full regulatory impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no impact on the private or voluntary sectors is foreseen. A Transposition Note is available and can be obtained from Plant Health Division, Defra, Foss House, Kings Pool, Peasholme Green, York YO1 7PX.
