AGRICULTURE, ENGLAND

The Common Agricultural Policy Single Payment and Support Schemes (Appeals) Regulations 2010

Made - - - - 5th January 2010
Laid before Parliament 14th January 2010
Coming into force - - 5th February 2010

The Secretary of State is a Minister designated(1) for the purposes of making Regulations under section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972(2) in relation to the common agricultural policy of the European Union.

These Regulations make provision for a purpose mentioned in that section and it appears to the Secretary of State that it is expedient for the references to the legislation set out in regulation 2 to be construed as references to that legislation as amended from time to time.

In accordance with section 56(1) of the Finance Act 1973(3), the Treasury consent to the making of these Regulations.

The Secretary of State makes these Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 2(2) of, and paragraph 1A of Schedule 2 to, the European Communities Act 1972 and by section 56(1) of the Finance Act 1973.

Title, application and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Common Agricultural Policy Single Payment and Support Schemes (Appeals) Regulations 2010; they apply in England and come into force on 5th February 2010.

Appeals

2.—(1) A farmer aggrieved by any initial determination relating under—

all as amended from time to time, may appeal against that determination to a person appointed by the Secretary of State.

- (2) The person must consider the appeal and report in writing to the Secretary of State, who must then make a final determination.
 - (3) The fee for the appeal is £100, payable when the appeal is lodged.
