**The Marketing of Fruit Plant Material
(Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005**

Made - - - - 12 April 2005
Coming into force - - 30 April 2005

The National Assembly for Wales, being designated⁽¹⁾ for the purposes of section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972⁽²⁾ in relation to the common agricultural policy of the European Community, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by that section makes the following Regulations:

Title, commencement and application

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as The Marketing of Fruit Plant Material (Amendment) (Wales) Regulations 2005 and come into force on 30 April 2005.

(2) These Regulations apply in relation to Wales.

Amendment of Regulations

2.—(1) The Marketing of Fruit Plant Material Regulations 1995⁽³⁾ shall be amended, in relation to Wales, in accordance with paragraph (2).

(2) For Schedule 1 to those Regulations there shall be substituted the following Schedule -

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations, which apply in relation to Wales, come into force on 30 April 2005. They give effect to Commission Directive [2003/111/EC](#) (O.J. No. L311, 27.11.2003, p.12) amending Annex II to Directive [92/34/EEC](#) (O.J. No. L157, 10.6.1992, p.10) on the marketing of fruit plant propagating material and fruit plants intended for fruit production.

Regulation 2 replaces Schedule 1 to the Marketing of Fruit Plant Material Regulations 1995 with a new Schedule 1 specifying the genera and species to which those Regulations apply.
