COMMISSION DECISION

of 20 February 1976

specifying the extent to which applications for import licences lodged in February 1976 for young bovine animals of highland breeds for fattening can be accepted

(76/269/EEC)

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 805/68 of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in beef and veal (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1855/74 (2), and in particular Article 21 (2) thereof,

Whereas Article 2(2) of Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3248/75 of 11 December 1975 concerning the issue while protective measures are in force of import licences for certain young bovine animals of highland breeds for fattening (3), provides that the Commission shall decide, subject to an overall monthly limit of 5 000 head, the extent to which applications for import licences can be accepted;

Whereas the applications submitted during the period 1 to 10 February 1976 are less than the prescribed limit; whereas the applications for import licences submitted should therefore be accepted in full,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article 1

The applications for import licences submitted during February 1976 pursuant to Regulation (EEC) No 3248/75 shall be accepted in full.

Article 2

This Decision is addressed to the Member States.
