FOURTH COMMISSION DIRECTIVE

of 22 September 1983

adapting to technical progress Annex VI to Council Directive 76/768/EEC on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to cosmetic products

(83/496/EEC)

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Directive 76/768/EEC of 27 July 1976 on the approximation of the laws of the Member States relating to cosmetic products ⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Directive 83/341/EEC ⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 8 (2) thereof,

Whereas, in the light of the most recent scientific and technical research results, the use of 4,4-dimethyl-1,3-oxazolidine and 1,2-dibromo-2,4-dicyanobutane as

preservatives in cosmetic products can be permitted, subject to certain conditions;

Whereas the provisions of this Directive are in accordance with the opinion of the Committee on the Adaption to Technical Progress of the Directives on the Removal of Technical Barriers to Trade in Cosmetic Products,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DIRECTIVE:

Article 1

The following is hereby added to Part 2 of Annex VI to Directive 76/768/EEC:

60	4,4-dimethyl-1,3-oxazolidine	0,1 %	Only for products rinsed off after use The pH of the finished product shall be not lower than 6'	

Article 2

Member States shall bring into force the laws, regulations or administrative provisions necessary to comply with this Directive not later than 31 December 1984.

They shall forthwith inform the Commission thereof,
