Council Directive 98/58/EC of 20 July 1998 concerning the protection of animals kept for farming purposes

Article 1

1 This Directive lays down minimum standards for the protection of animals bred or kept for farming purposes.

- 2 It shall not apply to:
 - a animals living in the wild;
 - b animals intended for use in competitions, shows, cultural or sporting events or activities;
 - c experimental or laboratory animals;
 - d any invertebrate animal.

3 This Directive shall apply without prejudice to specific Community rules laid down elsewhere, and in particular to Directives $88/166/\text{EEC}^{(1)}$, $91/629/\text{EEC}^{(2)}$ and $91/630/\text{EEC}^{(3)}$, which shall continue to apply.
