Article 10

In the case of foodstuffs which, from the microbiological point of view, are highly perishable and are therefore likely after a short period to constitute an immediate danger to human health, the date of minimum durability shall be replaced by the 'use by' date.

These particulars shall be followed by a description of the storage conditions which must be observed.

- 3 The date shall consist of the day, the month and, possibly, the year, in that order and in uncoded form.
- In some cases it may be decided by the procedure laid down in Article 20(2) whether the conditions laid down in paragraph 1 are fulfilled.
