#### REGULATION (EEC) No 1528/71 OF THE COUNCIL

#### of 12 July 1971

# amending Regulations No 120/67/EEC and No 359/67/EEC on the common organisation of the markets in cereals and in rice respectively

#### THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 43 thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission;

Having regard to the Opinion of the European Parliament;

Whereas Council Regulation No 120/67/EEC<sup>1</sup> of 13 June 1967 on the common organisation of the market in cereals, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2434/70<sup>2</sup> contains linguistic discrepancies in the description of certain products; whereas the wider definitions contained in the German and Dutch texts have resulted in higher export refunds being granted for certain products; whereas the German and Dutch texts of this Regulation should therefore be amended and the nomenclature of products falling within tariff sub-heading 11.02 B should therefore also be amended; whereas, moreover, the same alteration should be made to the Dutch text of Council Regulation 359/67/EEC<sup>3</sup> of 25 July 1967 of the common organisation of the market in rice, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2434/704;

Whereas certain difficulties have arisen in distinguishing rolled grains from flaked grains; whereas, in order to remedy this, these products should be regrouped under a single tariff sub-heading;

Whereas, to facilitate the application of the Common Customs Tariff, it has been found appropriate to classify pellets of products of the milling industry within tariff heading No 11.02; Whereas the amendments mentioned above also entail an amendment of the Common Customs Tariff annexed to Council Regulation (EEC) No 950/68<sup>5</sup> of 28 June 1968 on the Common Customs Tariff, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1/71<sup>6</sup>;

Whereas in accordance with Article 4 of Regulation No 120/67/EEC a single intervention price is fixed for maize when the quantities of indigenous maize marketed after a normal harvest are less than 45% of the amount consumed within the Community; whereas experience has shown that it is not necessary to fix derived intervention prices for maize, even if the quantities consumed exceed that percentage; whereas this system should in consequence be continued without restrictions provided there is no disturbance of the market;

Whereas, in accordance with Article 32 (3) of Regulation No 120/67/EEC, it was permissible to equate derived intervention prices for durum wheat, valid at secondary marketing centres, with the lowest intervention prices; whereas this system, established as a transitional measure and applied by the Member State whose production is largest in the Community, has given complete satisfaction; whereas therefore, it should be made definitive and extended to all marketing centres in Member States producing significant quantities of durum wheat;

Whereas Article 16 of Regulation No 120/67/EEC makes provision for granting export refunds on products listed in Article 1 of that Regulation in the form of foods set out in Annex B thereto; whereas, to allow the export of such products in the form of other goods, it is necessary to supplement that Annex; whereas, moreover, for reasons of clarity Annex B to Regulation 120/67/EEC as amended should be reproduced in full; whereas, for the same reasons, the wording of the nomenclature of products falling within tariff heading No 23.07 should be amended;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

#### Article 1

Regulation 120/67/EEC shall be amended as follows:

- (a) in Article 1 (c) and Article 11 (1) c of the German text, the words 'Grobgrieß und Feingrieß' shall be substituted for the words 'Grütze und Grieß';
- (b) in Article 1 (c) and Article 11 (1) (c) of the Dutch text, the words 'gries en griesmeel' shall be substituted for the words 'grutten, gries en griesmeel'.

#### Article 2

Regulation No 359/67/EEC shall be amended as follows:

- (a) in Article 1 (c) of the Dutch text, the words 'gries en griesmeel' shall be substituted for the words 'grutten, gries en griesmeel';
- (b) in Article 1 (c), the reference to tariff sub-heading '11.02 E VI' shall become '11.01 E II (e) 1'.

#### Article 3

Annex A to Regulation No 120/67/EEC shall be amended as follows:

1. The following shall be substituted for the descriptions of goods falling within tariff sub-heading 11.02:

2. The following shall be substituted for the description of goods falling within tariff heading 23.07:

#### Article 4

Article 4 of Regulation No 120/67/EEC shall be amended as follows:

(a) The following shall be substituted for the text of paragraph 2:

'By way of derogation from paragraph 1, a single intervention price shall be fixed for maize and a single derived intervention price for durum wheat. These prices shall be valid at all marketing centres for these cereals, with the exception of Duisburg for durum wheat, provided that the quantities of indigenous maize and durum wheat marketed at the time of a normal harvest are less than the quantities consumed within the Community. For maize this price shall correspond to the lowest derived intervention price fixed in the Community where paragraph 1 is applied. For durum wheat, this price shall be equal to the lowest price resulting from the application of paragraph 1.'.

(b) The following shall be substituted for the text of paragraph 4 (a):

'in respect of each Member State and each cereal produced in significant quantity in that Member State, except for maize and for durum wheat when the provisions of paragraph 2 are applied, the marketing centre to which the lowest derived intervention price applied and the price in question.'

(c) The following shall be substituted for the text of paragraph 4 (c):

'The intervention price for maize and the derived intervention price for durum wheat referred to in paragraph 2 where the provisions of that paragraph are applied.'

### Article 5

Annex I to this Regulation shall be substituted for Annex B to Regulation No 120/67/EEC.

#### Article 6

Regulation (EEC) No 950/68 shall be amended as follows:

1. The additional notes given in Annex II to this Regulation shall be substituted for the additional note to Chapter 11 of the Common Customs Tariff.

2. The nomenclature of products falling within tariff heading No 11.02 shall be as shown in Annex III to this Regulation.

#### Article 7

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities. It shall apply from 1 August 1971.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

#### ANNEX II

#### Additional notes

- 1. For the purpose of distinguishing between products falling within headings Nos 11.01 and 11.02 and those falling within sub-heading 23.02 A, products falling within headings Nos 11.01 and 11.02 shall be considered to be those having both:
  - starch content (determined by the modified Ewers polarimetric method) exceeding 45% by weight, referred to dry matter,
  - ash content, by weight, referred to dry matter (after deduction of any added mineral matter) not exceeding 1.6% in respect of rice, 2.5% in respect of wheat and rye, 3% in respect of barley, 4% in respect of buckwheat, 5% in respect of oats and 2% in respect of other cereals.

Germ of cereals, whole, rolled, flaked or ground, falls in all cases within heading No 11.02.

2. (a) Products from the milling of wheat, rye, oats, barley, rice and buckwheat (other than flour of germ of cereal) falling within headings 11.01 and 11.02 in accordance with additional note 1 of this chapter shall be classified under No 11.01 when the rate of passage through a screen of silk gauze or of artificial or synthetic fibre fabric of 0.315 mm mesh is 80% or more by weight.

Products shall however be classified under No 11.02 of the rate of passage through such a screen is less than 80% by weight.

- (b) Products from the milling of maize and sorghum (or 'milocorn') other than flour of germ of cereal falling within headings 11.01 and 11.02 in accordance with additional note 1 of this chapter shall be classified under No 11.01 when the rate of passage through a screen of silk gauze or of artificial or synthetic fibre of 0.5 mm mesh is 90% or more by weight. Products shall however be classified under No 11.02 if the rate of passage through such a screen is less than 90% by weight.
- (c) Products from the milling of cereals covered by this chapter, in the form of cylinders, pellets etc. agglomerated either by pressure alone, or with the aid of a binder, in a proportion of up to 3% by weight, are to be classified within the sub-heading 11.02 F.
- 3. For the purposes of sub-heading 11.02 A, 'groats and meal' means products obtained by fragmentation of cereal grains and meeting one of the following criteria:
  - (a) maize products must pass through a screen of silk gauze or of artificial or synthetic fibre fabric of 2 mm mesh in a proportion of at least 95% by weight;
  - (b) other cereal products must pass through a screen of silk gauze or of artificial or synthetic fibre fabric of 1.25 mm mesh in a proportion of at least 95% by weight.
