## REGULATION (EEC) No 1761/72 OF THE COMMISSION

of 11 August 1972

on a derogation from Regulation (EEC) No 1492/71 as regards the percentage of shrivelled grains in barley taken over by intervention agencies for the 1972/73 marketing year

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 120/67/EEC<sup>1</sup> of 13 June 1967 on the common organization of the market in cereals, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 796/72,<sup>2</sup> and in particular Article 7 (5) thereof;

Whereas Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1492/71<sup>3</sup> of 13 July 1971 fixing the procedure and conditions for the taking over of cereals by intervention agencies, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1422/72,<sup>4</sup> restricted the percentage of shrivelled barley grains to 15%;

Whereas, owing to the particularly unfavourable climatic conditions during the growth period of the cereals, barley of the 1972 harvest contains a large percentage of shrivelled grains; whereas the conditions fixed by Regulation (EEC) No 1492/71 should therefore be relaxed so that this barley can be taken over by intervention agencies;

Whereas relaxation of the take over conditions will mean that large quantities of barley with a relatively reduced nutritive value owing to the high shrivelled grain content will be offered for intervention; whereas intervention agencies remarketing this barley will have to take its nutritive value as compared with

that of other competing feedgrain into account; whereas, therefore, in order to adapt the price of this barley to its feed value when it is remarketed, a price reduction should be applied as soon as it is offered for intervention;

Whereas, to determine the amount of this reduction, the feed value of barley with a percentage of shrivelled grains more than 15% but not more than 25% should be compared with standard quality barley by reference to the difference in specific weight; whereas, taking account of this difference which may approximately be evaluated at 4%, and of the resulting loss in marketing value, the amount of the price reduction applicable to barley with a percentage of shrivelled grains more than 15% but not more than 25% should be fixed at a flat rate of 2 units of account per metric ton;

Whereas the Management Committee for cereals has not delivered an Opinion within the time limit set by its Chairman;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

## Article 1

By way of derogation from the eleventh indent of Article 2 (2) of Regulation (EEC) No 1492/71, the percentage of shrivelled grains in barley taken over by the intervention agencies shall not exceed 25% for the 1972/73 marketing year.

## Article 2

For barley with a percentage of shrivelled grains more than 15% but not more than 25%, a flat-rate reduction of 2 units of account per metric ton shall be applied during the 1972/73 marketing year.

## Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
