REGULATION (EEC) No 3564/73 OF THE COMMISSION

of 21 December 1973

amending Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2198/69 of 30 October 1969 concerning the periods of grace referred to in Article 10 (2) and (3) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 803/68 on the valuation of goods for customs purposes

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community;

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 803/68 (1) of 27 June 1968 on the valuation of goods for customs purposes, and in particular Article 10 (4) thereof;

Having regard to Commission Regulation (EEC) No⁻ 2198/69 (2) concerning the periods of grace referred to in Article 10 (2) and (3) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 803/68 on the valuation of goods for customs purposes, amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1038/71 (3) of 24 May 1971 and completed by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3105/73 (4) of 15 November 1973;

Whereas it has been possible to establish that certain goods not included in the tables annexed to the abovementioned Commission Regulations are usually sold with delivery periods exceeding six and twelve months respectively; whereas it is appropriate to provide in respect of those goods for a period of grace of twelve months or more as the case may be; whereas, however, pursuant to Article 10 (3) of the abovementioned Council Regulation that period of grace may not exceed twenty-four months;

Whereas the amendments to the Common Customs Tariff of the European Communities made in the meantime call for corresponding amendments in respect of certain items in the abovementioned tables;

Whereas the provisions provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the Opinion of the Customs Valuation Committee,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

The Annex to Commission Regulation (EEC) No 2198/69 of 30 October 1969 on the periods of grace referred to in Article 10 (2) and (3) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 803/68, as last amended by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3105/73 of 15 November 1973, shall be substituted by the table annexed to this Regulation.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force one month after its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
