COMMISSION REGULATION (EEC) No 3710/83

of 23 December 1983

on the supply of milled rice to the World Food Programme as food aid

THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1418/76 of 21 June 1976 on the common organization of the market in rice (1), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1566/83 (2), and in particular Article 25 thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 2750/75 of 29 October 1975 fixing criteria for the mobilization of cereals intended as food aid (3), as amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3331/82 (4), and in particular Article 6 thereof,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 1992/83 of 11 July 1983 laying down the implementing rules for 1983 for Regulation (EEC) No 3331/82 concerning food-aid policy and food-aid management (5),

Having regard to Council Regulation No 129 of 23 October 1962 on the value of the unit of account and the exchange rates to be applied for the purposes of the common agricultural policy (6), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2543/73 (7), and in particular Article 3 thereof,

Having regard to the opinion of the Monetary Committee,

Whereas on 26 April 1982 the Council of the European Communities expressed its intention to grant, under a Community measure, 5 968 tonnes of cereals to the World Food Programme under its food-aid programme for 1982;

Whereas, on 29 July 1983, the Commission of the European Communities decided to grant, under a Community measure, 992 tonnes of cereals for the World Food Programme under the food-aid programme for 1983;

Whereas it is necessary to provide for the carrying out of this measure in accordance with the rules laid down by Commission Regulation (EEC) No 1974/80 of 22 July 1980 laying down general implementing rules in respect of certain food-aid operations involving cereals and rice (8), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 3323/81 (9); whereas it is necessary to specify, for the purposes of the Community measures envisaged, the characteristics of the products to be supplied and the supply conditions which are set out in the Annex hereto;

Whereas the measures provided for in this Regulation are in accordance with the opinion of the Management Committee for Cereals,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The Italian intervention agency shall be charged with implementing the mobilization and supply procedures in accordance with the provisions of Regulation (EEC) No 1974/80 and with the conditions laid down in the Annex hereto.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

ANNEX

- 1. Programmes: 1982 and 1983
- 2. Recipient: World Food Programme (WFP)
- 3. Place or country of destination: Gambia
- 4. Product to be mobilized: wholly milled long grain rice
- 5. Total quantity: 2 400 tonnes (6 960 tonnes of cereals)
- 6. Number of lots: one
- 7. Intervention agency responsible for conducting the procedure:

Ente nazionale Risi, piazza Pio XI, 1, I-Milano (telex 334 032)

- 8. Method of mobilizing the product: the Community market
- 9. Characteristics of the goods:
 - rice of fair and sound merchantable quality, free from abnormal smell and pests
 - moisture : 15 %
 - broken rice: 5 % maximum
 - chalky grains: 5 % maximum
 - grains striated with red: 3 % maximum
 - spotted grains: 1,5 % maximum
 - stained grains: 1 % maximum
 - yellow grains: 0,050 % maximum
 - amber grains: 0,20 % maximum

10. Packaging:

- in new bags:
 - jute sacks of a minimum weight of 600 g, or
 - composite sacks jute/polypropylene of a minimum weight of 335 g
- net weight of the bags: 50 kg
- marking on the bags (in letters at least 5 cm high):
 'GAMBIA 1343 / RICE / BANJUL / GIFT OF THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY / ACTION OF THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME'
- 11. Port of shipment:

Any Community port accessible to ocean-going vessels with a shipping service to the recipient country during the period for shipment laid down in point 16. The tender must be accompanied by a statement from the port authorities attesting the existence of the service during the said period

- 12. Delivery stage: fob
- 13. Port of landing: —
- 14. Procedure to be applied in order to determine supply costs: mutual agreement
- 15. Deadline for the submission of tenders: 12 noon on 9 January 1984
- 16. Shipment period: 1 to 29 February 1984
- 17. Security: 12 ECU per tonne

Notes:

- 1. The successful tenderer shall forward, through the intermediary of the intervention agency, to the recipient on the latter's request and in accordance with his instructions the documents necessary for importation of the goods into the country of destination.
- 2. Since the goods may be rebagged, the successful tenderer must provide 2 % of empty bags of the same quality as those containing the goods, with the marking followed by a capital 'R'.
