

COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC) No 3797/91
of 19 December 1991

**amending Regulation (EEC) No 3493/90 laying down general rules for the grant
of premiums to sheepmeat and goatmeat producers**

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 3013/89 of 25 September 1989 on the common organization of the market in sheepmeat and goatmeat⁽¹⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1741/91⁽²⁾, and in particular Article 5 (8) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission⁽³⁾,

Whereas the concepts of 'eligible ewe' and 'eligible she-goat' as laid down in Regulation (EEC) No 872/84⁽⁴⁾, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 1970/87⁽⁵⁾, must be redefined because of the monitoring difficulties they entail; whereas, given the administrative difficulties associated with the elaboration of new definitions, Regulation (EEC) No 3493/90⁽⁶⁾ provided that they should be maintained for the 1991 marketing year; whereas, since the difficulties continue to exist, it is appropriate that the said definitions be maintained for the 1992 marketing year as well;

Whereas Regulation (EEC) No 3493/90 should be amended accordingly,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Article 5 of Regulation (EEC) No 3493/90 is hereby amended as follows:

- in the first paragraph the words '1991 marketing year' shall be replaced by '1992 marketing year',
- the second paragraph shall be deleted.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities*.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
