GENERAL PRINCIPLES

I^{XI} Article 6

Scientific substantiation for claims

- 1 Nutrition and health claims shall be based on and substantiated by generally accepted scientific evidence.
- 2 A food business operator making a nutrition or health claim shall justify the use of the claim.
- The [FI competent authority] may request a food business operator or a person placing a product on the market to produce all relevant elements and data establishing compliance with this Regulation.]
