THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EC) No 881/2002 imposing certain specific restrictive measures directed against certain persons and entities associated with Usama bin Laden, the Al-Qaida network and the Taliban, and repealing Council Regulation (EC) No 467/2001 prohibiting the export of certain goods and services to Afghanistan, strengthening the flight ban and extending the freeze of funds and other financial resources in respect of the Taliban of Afghanistan,⁽¹⁾ and in particular the first indent of Article 7(1) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Annex I to Regulation (EC) No 881/2002 lists the persons, groups and entities covered by the freezing of funds and economic resources under that Regulation.
- (2) On 11 August 2008, 16 September 2008, 3 October 2008, 21 October 2008, 2 December 2008, 10 December 2008, 23 December 2008, 30 January 2009, 13 February 2009, 23 February 2009, 5 March 2009, 13 March 2009, 18 March 2009, 23/24 March 2009, 20 April 2009, 3 June 2009, 17 July 2009 and 10 August 2009 the Sanctions Committee of the United Nations Security Council decided to amend the identifying data concerning several persons, groups and entities to whom the freezing of funds and economic resources should apply.
- (3) Annex I should therefore be updated accordingly,
