## Serious transmissible diseases

The diseases listed by the OIE in [<sup>F1</sup>Chapter 1.3 of the Terrestrial Animal Health Code, 2019] edition, and in Chapter 1.3 of the [<sup>F2</sup>Aquatic Animal Health Code, 2019] edition, shall be regarded as serious transmissible diseases for the purposes of general animal health restrictions, as provided for in Article 6(1)(b)(ii) of Regulation (EC) No 1069/2009.
