An Act for continuing, for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers, of an Act, passed in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing and widening the Road from the Town of Halisax, in the West Riding of the County of York, to the Town of Shessield, in the same Riding, so far as relates to the Road from Hudderssield to Penisson.

[7th May 1798.]

HEREAS by an Act, made in the Seventeenth Year of the Presemble Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for repairing and widening the Road from the Town of Halifax, in the West Riding of the County of York, to the Town of Shessield, in the same Riding, certain Tolls, Powers, and Authorities were given and granted to the Trustees therein named, and their Successors, to be appointed for the Purposes therein mentioned; which said Act was to have Continuance from the First Day of May, in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and seventy-seven, for the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas by the said Act the said Road was divided into Three separate and distance [Loc. & Per.]

tinct Districts; and the Road from Huddersfield to Penistone was made the Second District: And whereas a considerable Sum of Money hath been borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls authorized to be collected upon the faid Second Diffrict of the Road described in the faid Act, leading from Huddersfield to Penistone, which Money still remains due, and cannot be repaid, and the faid Diffrict of Road completed and kept in Repair, unless the Term of the said Act, so far as relates to the Road within the faid District, be further continued, and the Powers thereof enlarged: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the faid recited Act, and the feveral Clauses, Powers, Exemptions, Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things therein contained, and which are now in Force (except fuch as are hereby varied, altered, or repealed, and also such as relate to Exemptions from Stamp Duties) shall, so far as relate to the Road in the faid Second District, be, and are hereby continued for and during the further Term herein-after mentioned, as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purpofes, as if the same were herein particularly inferted, repeated, and re-enacted, but subject nevertheless to the Amendments, Alterations, Variations, and Additions herein contained; and that this Act, and the additional Term hereby granted, shall be subject and liable to the Payment of all Money now due and owing, or which shall be borrowed, on the Credit of the faid recited Act and this prefent Act, with respect to the said District of Road from Huddersfield to Penistone, and of all Interest due or to grow due thereon respectively.

Tolls to be taken initead of those

III. And whereas the Tolls by the faid recited Act authorized to be taken on the faid Second District of Road, are inadequate for the Pur-

pose of sufficiently amending and completing the said Road, and keeping granted by the same in kepair, and repaying the Money borrowed thereon, and Act. the Interest thereof; be it therefore further enacted, That the said Tolls shall be, and they are hereby repealed; and that instead thereof the respective Tolls following shall be demanded and taken at any of the Turnpike Gates or Toll Houses which are or shall be erected in, upon, or on the Side of or across the said Road from Hudderssield to Penistone, by such Person or Persons as the said Trustees, or any Five or more of them, shall appoint for that Purpose, before any Cattle or Carriage shall be permitted to pass through the said Turnpike Gates or Toll Houses; (that is to say),

For every Coach, Landau, Chaife, Berlin, Hearfe, Chariot, Chair, Curricle, or Chaife Marine, drawn by Six Horses or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Three Shillings; and drawn by Four Horses or Beatts of Draught, the Sum of Two Shillings and Three-pence; and if drawn by Two Horses or Beasts of Draught, the Sum of One Shilling

and Sixpence; and if by One only, the Sum of Nine-pence:

For every Horse, Ox, or other Beast of Draught drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage laden with any Block or Blocks of Stone or Marble, or with Timber, or drawing any Mill Stone or Mill Stones, the Sum of Nine-pence; and for every other Waggon, Wain, Cart, or Carriage, drawn by Five or more Horses, Oxen, or other Beasts of Draught, the Sum of Three Shillings; and if drawn by lefs than Five, then for every Horse, Ox, or other Beast of Draught, the sum of Ninepence:

For every Drove of Oxen, or other Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Sixpence per Score; and so in Proportion for any greater or

less Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Sheep. Lambs, or Swine, the Sum of Nine-pence per Score; and so in Proportion for any greater or less Number: And.

For every Horse, Mare, Gelding, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of Three-pence.

Which fail feveral Tolls hereby granted shall be, and the same are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and the same and every Part thereof shall be collected, recovered, levied, paid, applied, assigned, varied, and disposed of in fuch and the fame Manner, and by fuch Ways and Means, and with fuch Remedies for Non-payment or Evanon thereof, and with fuch Powers, Provisoes. Exemptions, and Restrictions, as are contained in the said recited Act with respect to the said Road from Huddersfield to Penissone, but subject to the Regulations and Alterations in this Act contained.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the feveral Inhabitants of the re- Inhabitants fpective Parishes, Townships, Places, and Divisions within the faid District to do Statute of Pond, who by Law are chargeable with Statute Work of the Work on the of Road, who by Law are chargeable with Statute Work, shall yearly Road. and every Year do and perform such Proportion of their Statute Work on fuch Parts of the faid Diffrict of Road as are now made, or on any new Roads which may hereafter be laid out within the faid Diffrict by virtue of the faid recited Act or this Act, within their respective Townships, Parishes, Places, or Divisions, and in such Manner as the Trustees acting for the faid District, or any Five or more of them, shall direct and require; fo as no fuch Statute Work or Duty to be done in

the Township of Hudderssield upon the said District of Road, or any Part thereof, shall exceed in the Whole One Day's Work yearly; any Thing in the said recited Act or this Act contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

Expences of the Act.

V. And be it further enacted, That all the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to and attending the obtaining and passing of this Act, shall be paid out of any Money collected or received, or to be collected or received, within the said District by virtue of the said recited Act and this Act.

Publick Act.

VI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed, adjudged, and taken to be a Publick Act, and shall be judicially taken Notice of as such, by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons, without specially pleading the same.

Continuance of the Act.

VII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take place upon the Third Wednesday next after the passing thereof; and, together with so much of the said recited Act as by this Act is not varied, altered, or repealed, with respect to the said District of Road from Hudderssield to Penistone, shall continue in Force for and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
