An Act for continuing for Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament, the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers, of Two Acts, passed in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, and the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, so far as the said Acts relate to the repairing and widening the Road from the North End of Dapden Wharf, in the Parish of Stoke, next Guldeford, through Guldeford, to Andrew's Cross, and to Alfold Bars, in the County of Surrey, and from thence to New Bridge, in the County of Sussessing Sussessi

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of Preamble.

His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled, An Act for repairing and widening the Road from the North End of Dapdon and Wharf, in the Parish of Stoke, next Guldeford, through Guldeford to Andrew's Cross, and to Alfold Bars, in the County of Surrey, and from thence to Saint Mary's Gate, in Arundel, in the County of Sussex, certain Tolls,

Powers, and Authorities, were given and granted for repairing and

amending the said Road; and which Act was to have Continuance for

and during the Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End

of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas by the said Act the

said Road was divided into Two Districts, and such Part thereof as leads

from the North End of the Timber Wharf called Dapdon Wharf, in the

Parish of Stoke, next Guldeford, through the Borough of Guldeford, and

the Towns of Shalford and Bramley, to Alfold Bars, in that Part of the

Parish of Alfold which lies in the County of Surrey, and the Road leading

out of the said Road, through a Lane called Pain's Hill Lane, from

Smithbrook to Andrew's Cross, in the said County, was called The First

District of the said Road; and such other Part thereof as leads from Al-

feld Bars aforefaid, through Loxwood New Pound Common, in the Parish

of Wisborough Green, over New Bridge, through Hadfold's-hern, Pulbo-

rough, Hardham, Coldwaltham, and Bury, to Saint Mary's Gate, in the Borough of Arundel, in the County of Sussex, was called The Second Distriet of the said Road: And whereas by another Act, passed in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, the said recited Act was amended and continued, from and after the Expiration of the Term thereby granted, for and during the further Term of Twenty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament: And whereas the Trustees acting in the Execution of the said Acts have made great Progress in repairing the said Road, and a considerable Sum of Money, borrowed upon the Credit of the Tolls within each of the said Districts, now remains due; which cannot be repaid, and the said Road effectually amended and kept in Repair, unless the Term of the said Acts (which is near expiring) be further continued, and some Amendments made thereto; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal. and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the Term granted by the said recited Acts shall be repealed; and that the said recited Acts, and all the Clauses, Powers, Authorities, Provisions, Exemptions Penalties, Forfeitures, Matters, and Things, therein contained, (except such Parts thereof as are hereby varied, altered, or repealed, and also such as relate to Exemption from Stamp Duties), shall be and remain in full Force and Effect, and, together with this present Act, shall be put in Execution for the several Purposes thereby and hereby intended, for and during the Term herein-after granted, as fully and effectually, in all Respects and to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, as if the same were expressly repeated and re-enacted in the Body of this present Act; which said Term hereby granted shalk be and is hereby declared to be subject and liable to the Payment of all Monies now due on each District of the said Road respectively, on the Credit of the said recited Acts, or which shall or may hereafter be borrowed and become due on the Credit of the said recited Acts and of this Act, and all Interest due and to become due for the same respectively.

II. And be it surther enacted, That Thomas Attsield, Robert Cooke, George Chandler junior, William Chandler, Thomas Chandler, Edward Ede, Giles Evershed, Thomas Evershed, William Haydon junior, George Johnson junior, John King junior, Jonathan Merryman, John Maybank, Edward Napper, William Newland junior, James Stilwell, Richard Sparkes junior, John

John Sparkes junior, John Talbot, Richard Watson, and George Waugh, being duly qualified according to the Provisions of the said first recited Act, shall be and are hereby added to and joined with the surviving and remaining Trustees nominated in or elected by virtue of the said recited Acts, or either of them, for the Purpole of putting the said recited Acts -and this Act in Execution, within the First District of the said Road.

III. And be it further enacted, That George Barrett, Uriah Balchin, Richard Edwards, Christopher Elliott, Charles Ellis, Richard Eager, Tho-Trustees to mas Ireland, Edward Ireland, John King junior, Edward Napper, Denzil second in the Onslow, Middleton Onslow, William Onslow, and Thomas Seward junior, being duly qualified as aforesaid, shall be and are hereby added to and joined with the furviving and remaining Trustees nominated in or elected by virtue of the said recited Acts, or either of them, for the Purpose of putting the said recited Acts and this Act in Execution, within that Part of the Second District of the said Road in respect whereof the said recited Acts are not hereby repealed.

IV. And whereas it is proper that the Trustees for the Second District Trustees difof the said Road should be discharged from the Care and Management of charged from fuch Part thereof as extends from the West Side of the Stream at New a certain Part Bridge, through Hadfold's-hern, Pulborough, Hardham, Coldwaltham, and of the Second Bury, to Saint Mary's Gate, in the said Borough of Arundel, and that such Part Road. of the said Second District should be no longer continued as a Portion of the said Turnpike Road; be it therefore further enacted, That, from and after the Commencement of this Act, the Trustees for the said Second District shall be and are hereby discharged from the Care and Management of that Part of the Second District of the said Road which extends from the West Side of the Stream at New Bridge, through Hadfold's-hern, Pulborough, Hardham, Coldwaltham, and Bury, to Saint Mary's Gate, in the said Borough of Arundel; and that such Part of the Second District of the said Road shall no longer be continued or be deemed or taken as a Portion of the said Turnpike Road, or of the said Second District thereof; and that so much of the said recited Acts as directs or authorizes the making, repairing, and keeping in Repair, such Part of the said Second District of the said Road, and the demanding and taking any Toll thereon, or upon any Part thereof, shall be and the same is hereby repealed; any Thing in the said recited Acts or in this Act to the contrary hereof notwithstanding.

VI. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed, adjudged, Publick Act, and taken to be a Publick Act; and be judicially taken Notice of as such, by all Judges, Justices, and other Persons whomsoever, without specially pleading the same.
