Part I

Introductory

Title and commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Jobseekers (Northern Ireland) Order 1995.

(2) This Order comes into operation on such day or days as the Department may by order appoint^{F1}.

Interpretation

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954^{F2} applies to Article 1 and the following provisions of this Order as it applies to a Measure of the Northern Ireland Assembly.

(2) In this Order—

(c) except in prescribed circumstances, a person who is not a member of a [^{F13} couple] and a member of the same household for whom that person is responsible and who is a child or a person of a prescribed description;

“personal pension scheme” means—

(a) a personal pension scheme as defined by section 1 of the Pension Schemes (Northern Ireland) Act 1993;

(b) [^{F18}an annuity contract or trust scheme approved under section 620 or 621 of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988 or a substituted contract within the meaning of section 622(3) of that Act which is treated as having become a registered pension scheme by virtue of paragraph 1(1)(f) of Schedule 36 to the Finance Act 2004; and

(c) a personal pension scheme approved under Chapter 4 of Part 14 of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988 which is treated as having become a registered pension scheme by virtue of paragraph 1(1)(g) of Schedule 36 to the Finance Act 2004;]
