Seed Potatoes

ORDER, DATED 3RD JUNE 1974, MADE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 2(4) OF THE AGRICULTURAL MARKETING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

The Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland after such consultation as is required and in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 2(4) of the Agricultural Marketing Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Seed Potato Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 3rd June 1974.

Amendments

2. The Seed Potato Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1961 as approved by the Seed Potato Marketing Scheme (Approval) Order (Northern Ireland) 1961(b) and as amended by the Seed Potato Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order 1964(c) and as amended by the Seed Potato Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order 1973(d) shall be further amended as follows:—

At the end of paragraph (1) of Article 5 the following words shall be added:—

“If at the election in 1974 two Regional members are returned unopposed, the two members elected shall decide by lot which one of them shall hold office for four years and the remaining one shall cease to hold office after two years.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order amends the Seed Potato Marketing Scheme by providing procedure for deciding which Regional member shall hold office for four years should two Regional members be returned unopposed at the election in 1974.
