Wages Regulation (Paper Box)

ORDER, DATED 15TH NOVEMBER 1974, MADE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF MANPOWER SERVICES UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945.

The Department of Manpower Services in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland):

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974(b) and the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974(c) shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 3rd day of December 1974, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

"COST OF LIVING SAFEGUARD

Paragraph 7A.

A payment of £1·20 per week shall be made to full time adult employees with proportionate increases to juveniles and learners, and if after 2nd July 1974 the Retail Price Index exceeds the appropriate trigger points mentioned in the Pay Board Stage 3 Guidance Leaslet of 7th June 1974, the appropriate Cost of Living Supplement shall be paid accordingly, provided always that the appropriate increases shall continue to be paid subsequent to, but not augmented beyond trigger point 213·3 or the 16th day of November 1974 whichever shall occur the sooner."

NOTES WHICH DO NOT FORM PART OF THE ORDER

1.—The "Trigger points" listed in the Pay Board leaflet dated 7th June 1974 mentioned in the above paragraph are as follows:—

- 2.—The full time adult "Cost of Living Supplement" shall be 40p per "Trigger Point."
- 3.—The above increase in Statutory Minimum Remuneration which affects only female workers, has been made to partially comply with the provisions of the Equal Pay Act (N.I.) 1970.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Holidays and Holiday Remuneration

The Paper Box Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(e) (Order N.I.B. (86)) as amended by the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974 (Order N.I.B. (95)) shall have effect as if the Schedule thereto for Part III paragraph 3 there was substituted the following paragraph:—

Paragraph 3.

(1) In addition to the customary holidays specified in Part II and subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph and of paragraph 4 an employer shall, between 31st March 1974 and 30th September 1974 and in each succeeding year between 31st March and 30th September (hereafter referred to as the "holiday season") allow a holiday (hereafter referred to as "an annual holiday") to every worker in his employment to whom this Schedule applies who was employed by him during the twelve months immediately preceding the commencement of the holiday season for any of the periods specified below, and the duration of the annual holiday shall be related to his period of employment during that twelve months as follows:—

- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-paragraph (1):—
 - (a) the number of days annual holiday which an employer is required to allow to a worker in respect of a period of employment during the 12 months immediately preceding 31st March 1971 and during the 12 months immediately preceding 31st March in each succeeding year shall not exceed in the aggregate three times the number of days constituting the workers' normal working week;
 - (b) the holiday season may be varied in any year by agreement between the employer and the worker if they jointly notify the Wages Council of such agreement and any reference to a holiday season in this Schedule shall be construed accordingly.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order comes into operation on 3rd December 1974.

The First Schedule amends the Paper Box Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1972 (Order N.I.B. (91)) as amended by the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974 (Order N.I.B. (95)) and the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974 (Order N.I.B. (97)) by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration payable to female workers fixed by those Orders.

The Second Schedule amends the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 (Order N.I.B. (86)) as amended by the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1974 (Order N.I.B. (95)).

Orders N.I.B. (95) and N.I.B. (97) are revoked.

New provisions in the Schedules are printed in italics.
