WAGES COUNCILS**Linen and Cotton Embroidery Wages Council (Abolition) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1975**

Made 12th December 1975

Coming into operation 2nd January 1976

The Department of Manpower Services, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a) and now vested in it(b), hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Linen and Cotton Embroidery Wages Council (Abolition) Order (Northern Ireland) 1975 and shall come into operation on 2nd January 1976.

Abolition of Wages Council

2. The Linen and Cotton Embroidery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) is hereby abolished.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order abolishes the Linen and Cotton Embroidery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) which was established in 1922 as a Trade Board under the Trade Boards Act 1909. The Trade Board was converted into a Wages Council by the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945.

The Wages Council operated in relation to workers employed in the linen and cotton embroidery trade in Northern Ireland.
