Livestock Marketing Commission (Maximum Levy) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1976

Made 21st June 1976

Coming into operation . . . 2nd August 1976

To be laid before Parliament under paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 1 to the Northern Ireland Act 1974

The Department(a) of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 4(7) of the Livestock Marketing Commission Act (Northern Ireland) 1967(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Livestock Marketing Commission (Maximum Levy) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1976 and shall come into operation on 1976.

Interpretation

- 2. In these regulations—
- "Act" means the Livestock Marketing Commission Act (Northern Ireland) 1967.
- "Department" means the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland.

Increase in maximum of levy

- 3. The sums specified in sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Act (being maximum sums payable by way of levy on livestock slaughtered in or sent out of Northern Ireland) shall be varied as follows:—
 - (a) the sum of sixpence (for each sheep) shall be increased to 10p; and
 - (b) the sum of five shillings (for each bovine animal) shall be increased to one pound.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations increase the maximum of the levy on livestock slaughtered in or sent out of Northern Ireland as permitted under the Livestock Marketing Commission Act (Northern Ireland) 1967 from $2\frac{1}{2}p$ to 10p for sheep and from 25p to £1 for bovine animals.
