**Landing of Carcasses and Animal Products (Amendment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1976**

Made 2nd November 1976
Coming into operation 8th November 1976

The Department(a) of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 18 and 53 of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1958(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Landing of Carcasses and Animal Products (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1976 and shall come into operation on 8th November 1976.

*Amendment of the Landing of Carcasses and Animal Products Order
(Northern Ireland) 1970*

2. The Landing of Carcasses and Animal Products Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(c) as amended by the Landing of Carcasses and Animal Products (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972(d) shall be further amended as follows:—

In paragraph 1 of the First Schedule after the words “(other than hams, luncheon meats, frankfurters and other cured sausages)” there shall be inserted the words “which in the opinion of an inspector are cooked throughout their substance and which are”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The Landing of Carcases and Animal Products Order (Northern Ireland) 1970 prohibits the landing in Northern Ireland from any country other than the Republic of Ireland, of carcases or animal products except under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence issued by the Department.

The products mentioned in the First Schedule of the Order are, however, exempted from the restriction.

The amendment Order amplifies one of the exempted items (i.e. certain animal products in sealed metal or glass containers) so as to make it clear that the exemption relates to fully cooked canned animal products only.
