Rainbow Trout Waters Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1976

Made 8th November 1976 1st January 1977 Coming into operation

The Fisheries Conservancy Board for Northern Ireland, in exercise of its powers under Section 26 of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, with the approval of the Department(b) of Agriculture hereby makes the following Byelaws:

Citation

1. These Byelaws may be cited as the Rainbow Trout Waters Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1976, and shall come into operation on 1st January, 1977.

Close Season for Rainbow Trout Waters

2. There shall be no close season for angling for rainbow trout in the following waters:

Corranny Lake, Co. Fermanagh Lough Coole, Co. Fermanagh Brantry Lake, Co. Tyrone Roughan Lake, Co. Tyrone Henderson's Lake, Co. Londonderry Castledillon Lake, Co. Armagh Tullynawood Lake, Co. Armagh Darkley Lake, Co. Armagh Lower Quoile Reservoir, Co. Antrim Mossley Mill Pond, Co. Antrim Tonaghmore Reservoir, Co. Down Warrenpoint Waterworks Reservoir, Co. Down Ballymartin Lough, Co. Down Ballymacashon Lough, Co. Down Kernan Lake, Co. Down Pepper's Lake, Co. Down Holybank Bleachworks Dam, Belfast.

Revocation

3. The Rainbow Trout Waters Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1975(c) are hereby revoked.
