CLEAN AIR

Smoke Control Areas (Exempted Fireplaces) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977

Made 29th November 1977

Coming into operation . . . 9th January 1978

The Department of the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by section 11(7) of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and now vested in it(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, being satisfied that the class of fireplace described in column (1) of the Schedule can be used for burning fuel other than authorised fuels without producing a substantial quantity of smoke, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Smoke Control Areas (Exempted Fireplaces) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1977 and shall come into operation on 9th January 1978.

Revocation

2. The Smoke Control Areas (Exempted Fireplaces) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1976(c) are hereby revoked.

Exempted fireplaces

3. The class of fireplace described in column (1) of the Schedule shall, subject to the conditions specified in column (2), be exempted from the provisions of section 11 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964.

SCHEDULE

Class of fireplace

Conditions

The fireplace known as the Rayburn Prince 76 and manufactured by Glynwed Domestic and Heating Appliances Limited

The fireplace shall be installed, maintained and operated so as to minimise the emission of smoke and in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions issued in January 1976 (Ref. RP76/2), August 1976 (Ref. RP76/3) and April 1977 (Ref. RP76/4). No fuel shall be used other than selected washed coal

doubles and trebles.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

Section 11 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 empowers district councils to declare the whole or any part of their district to be a smoke control area in which the emission of smoke is, generally, prohibited. These regulations exempt the Rayburn Prince 76 Fireplace from the provisions of that section, upon certain conditions as to installation, maintenance and operation including the type of fuel to be used.
