ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES**Prohibition of Right-Hand Turn (Larne) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979**

Made 4th October 1979

Coming into operation 12th November 1979

The Department of the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 19 of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Prohibition of Right-Hand Turn (Larne) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979 and shall come into operation on 12th November 1979.

Prohibition of right-hand turn

2. Subject to article 3 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle proceeding on the road specified in column 1 of the schedule to make a right-hand turn into the road specified in column 2 while proceeding in the direction specified in column 3.

Exemptions

3. Article 2 shall not apply to:—

- (a) vehicles used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (b) a vehicle, the driver of which is acting upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden.

The Harbour Highway, Larne	Pound Street	Westerly

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This order prohibits traffic proceeding in a westerly direction along the Harbour Highway, Larne from making a right-hand turn into Pound Street.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the order have been erected on the road.

Any person who acts in contravention of the order shall be guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.
