Firearms (Variation of Fees) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979

Made 19th February 1979
Coming into operation . . . 1st April 1979
To be laid before Parliament

The Secretary of State in pursuance of section 47 of the Firearms Act (Northern Ireland) 1969(a) and with the approval of the Treasury hereby makes the following order:

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Firearms (Variation of Fees) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1979.

Variation of fees

- 2. The fees specified by section 27(1) of the Firearms Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 to be payable for the grant, renewal, or variation of a firearm certificate shall be varied as follows:
 - (a) on the grant of a firearm certificate the fee shall be £18;
 - (b) on the renewal of a firearm certificate the fee shall be £11; and
 - (c) on any variation of a firearm certificate (otherwise than when it is renewed or replaced at the same time) so as to increase the number of firearms to which the certificate relates or to substitute a firearm (other than a shotgun or air weapon) of a higher calibre or of a different type for one specified in the certificate or on the replacement of a certificate which has been lost or destroyed or for other cause cannot be produced the fee shall be £11.

Revocation

3. Article 2(1) of the Firearms (Variation of Fees) Order (Northern Ireland) 1977(b) is hereby revoked.

Medicines (Exemptions from Restrictions on the Retail Sale or Supply of Veterinary Drugs) Order 1979

This Order has been made by the Secretary of State concerned with health in England, the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health and with agriculture in Scotland and in Wales, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, and the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 57(1), (2) and 129(4) of the Medicines Act 1968.

In pursuance of paragraph 11 of Schedule 4 to that Act this Order has been registered as a Northern Ireland statutory rule under the Statutory Rules Act (Northern Ireland) 1958. It is printed in full in the volume of United Kingdom Statutory Instruments for 1979 and has been numbered 45 in that series.
