## North Coast (Prohibition of Herring Fishing) Revocation Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1981

The Department(a) of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 124(1) and 124(2) of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

### Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the North Coast (Prohibition of Herring Fishing) Revocation Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1981 and shall come into operation on 14th August 1981.

#### Revocation

2. The North Coast (Prohibition of Herring Fishing) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1981(c) are hereby revoked.

# **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations revoke the North Coast (Prohibition of Herring Fishing) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1981 (S.R. 1981 No. 100) which prohibited fishing for herring in an area of sea insofar as it is within British fishery limits off the north coast of Northern Ireland bounded to the south by the parallel of 55° north latitude, by the Northern Ireland coast from a point at 55° north latitude to Magilligan Point in County Londonderry and by a line drawn from Magilligan Point to Greencastle Fort in County Donegal and extending from the baselines from which the breadth of the territorial sea is measured out to the median line with Scotland.
