## SOCIAL SECURITY

The Social Security (1980 No. 2 Order) (Specified Sum) Order (Northern Ireland) 1981

The Department of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 6(2)(b) of the Social Security (No. 2) (Northern Ireland) Order 1980(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:

## Citation

1. This order may be cited as the Social Security (1980 No. 2 Order) (Specified Sum) Order (Northern Ireland) 1981.

Increase of sum specified in Article 6(1)(b) of the Social Security (No. 2) (Northern Ireland) Order 1980

2. In Article 6 of the Social Security (No. 2) (Northern Ireland) Order 1980 (supplementary benefit in cases affected by trade disputes) the sum which, by reference to the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1981(b), is, with effect from 23rd November 1981 (the date on which that order comes into operation), substituted for the sum of £12 specified in paragraph (1)(b) of that Article is the sum of £13.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This order states the sum to which the sum specified in Article 6(1)(b) of the Social Security (No. 2) (Northern Ireland) Order 1980 is, by virtue of the operation of the Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order (Northern Ireland) 1981, automatically increased (from £12 to £13).

Under that Article 6(1), payment of supplementary pension or allowance to or in respect of a person affected by a trade dispute is not made if the weekly rate is equal to or less than the sum specified and is made at a rate equal to the difference if the weekly rate is more than the sum specified.
