Movement of Animals (Records) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982

Made 21st July 1982 26th July 1982 Coming into operation

The Department of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 44 of the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Movement of Animals (Records) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1982 and shall come into operation on 26th July 1982.

Amendment of the Movement of Animals (Records) Order (Northern Ireland) 1980

- 2. The Movement of Animals (Records) Order (Northern Ireland) 1980(b) shall be amended as follows:-
 - (1) In Article 3(3) after the words "make a record of each such beast" there shall be inserted the words "and shall within 24 hours furnish to the Department a copy of that record".
 - (2) In Article 7(2) for the words "Articles 3(1) or 4(1)" there shall be substituted the words "Articles 3 or 4".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

The Movement of Animals (Records) Order (Northern Ireland) 1980 requires persons engaging in the purchase or sale of cattle, goats, sheep or swine to make and retain detailed records of such purchases or sales.

This order amends the 1980 order by requiring saleyard operators to furnish to the Department of Agriculture a copy of the sales record made by them in respect of the sale of cattle and to retain their sales records in the case of cattle for at least 3 years and in the case of goats, sheep and swine for at least 12 months.

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This Order has been exempted from printing by the Statutory Rules (Northern Ireland) Order 1979. A summary is given in the List of Statutory Rules of a Local Character under the heading PUBLIC HEALTH.
